Along Capitol Corridors  
**Push \$5,000,000 Job Of Renovating State Capitol**

 ALBANY—A \$5,000,000 job of renovating the massive old state capitol is being pushed in hopes of finishing the intricate modernization program by the end of 1950.  
 Scores of workmen have been swarming over the building through the spring, summer and fall months since 1946.  
 They now have the building filled with scaffolding, temporary steel bracing and machinery as they enter the stretch drive in their effort to practically rebuild the third, fourth and fifth floors of the 66-year-old building.

The office of the state architect lists four reasons for making the changes in the building:  
 1. To replace worn out and outmoded heating, electric and sanitary systems.  
 2. To make more office space available for the increased membership of the Senate and Assembly, and the various committees and commissions associated with the legislature.  
 3. To make the building conform with advances made in building construction since the capitol originally was built.  
 4. To provide "much-needed spaces for ordinary and necessary business of the regular employees and committees."  
 Senate and Assembly representatives expect that the entire operation will be completed in 1950. However, that completion will depend on how much work can be accomplished before the workmen must be called off the job next winter when the legislature convenes.  
 To facilitate the operation, both the Senate and Assembly chambers and the third floor have been closed to visitors for the summer. The chambers are boarded off and sealed so that dirt and dust from the construction work will not filter into working offices.  
 This year's work involves putting a new floor in the Senate chamber, and installing new seats in the galleries. The Senate lobby, together with the private offices of the lieutenant governor and the minority leader, also are being remodeled.  
 On the Assembly side, the lobby and the post office have been torn out, and will be reconstructed.  
 New mezzanines are being constructed throughout the upper three stories of the building, to furnish the many new offices the various legislative and state officials need.  
 Legislative spokesman point out that the construction work has been planned and initiated entirely by representatives of both houses.  
 The money for the work is included in the legislative budget, which both houses submit to Governor Dewey for inclusion in the state budget. This budget can not be altered by the governor, but must be submitted as part of his fiscal program with out change.  
 The first major appropriation for the work was made in 1947 when the legislature appropriated \$400,000. That was followed the following year by an appropriation of \$1,700,000.  
 In the budget for the current year, the legislature approved an expenditure of \$1,000,000 for the job, but that added to that was a deficiency appropriation from the previous year of \$388,500.  
 Appropriations made from 1936 to 1947 account for the remainder of the \$5,000,000. The legislative spokesman said it was possible that the total amount may climb above that figure before all of the work is finished.
