proposed route will be signed by May and work is expected to begin in June.

George Greenblade of the Transportation Department said the highway will run as planned because of an alternate route has proven to be much more costly, in order to go further up the hill, he explained, a climbing lane would be needed because of the grade coming from Danville. According to John Tahagan, regional design engineer, cost for rights-of-way through an alternate route would be \$2 million higher. He also pointed out that trucks would be more likely to stay on Route 26 to avoid the steep up-grade, thus defeating one of the main purposes of the new highway.

It would also be more costly to span Bradner Creek with a bridge rather than a culvert, Tahagan said. The engineer said all possible would be done to preserve the natural beauty of the Ulyette's backyard, but explained that a bridge would increase the project cost by \$1 million.

The officials promised to review complaints of inequitable appraisals by the state.

Alex Kocycynski, DOT regional director, said his department realizes there will be some damage done. "But I assure you," he added, "if we had decided on another route, there would be another meeting someplace else."

He also said, although he could guarantee nothing, there would be no blasting near the Reardon property. Reardon said he feared the balance of his well could be affected by blasting.

When asked about culvert flooding near the Ulyette property, he said the culvert is constructed to withstand "waters of a 100-year flood." The officials said water will never come over the road because it will be held by an embankment.
