BOW AND ARROW SEASON LISTED AT STATE PARK

In a spirit of cooperation to fur-
nish some relief to farmers and or-
chardists adjacent to Letchworth
State Park from damage to crops
by deer, Letchworth State Park will
have an open season for the hunting
of deer with long bow and arrows
only (fire arms not permitted), com-
mencing November 10, 1946, for a
three weeks' period as follows: No-
vember 10 to November 23 inclusive,
only buck deer to be taken. Novem-
ber 24 to November 30 inclusive ex-
cept on Sunday, November 28, either
buck or doe deer may be taken.

Licenses required for hunting in
the park will be the same as those
necessary for hunting outside the
park. In addition, a special bow
and arrow license is required which
will cost \$5.25 for the first two
weeks of hunting. Also, a special
buck and doe license for the last
week of the season is required.
These licenses may be secured from
the usual agencies of the State Con-
servation Department and will not
be on sale at the office of the Gen-
esee State Park Commission.

Letchworth State Park will be
closed to the public, in the interest
of public safety, November 10
through November 30. Only hunt-
ers with bow and arrows will be
allowed in the park during this spe-
cial hunting period of three weeks.

N. Y. Farm Income Decreases Slightly

Albany—Prices received by New
York farmers for their products
dropped slightly from July to Aug-
ust, but were still 14 per cent higher
than those for the same period last
year. The State Agriculture De-
partment in a joint federal-state re-
port last week, set the mid-August
price index at 280. This was five
points lower than a month earlier,
but 34 points above the 1947 mid-
August figure.
