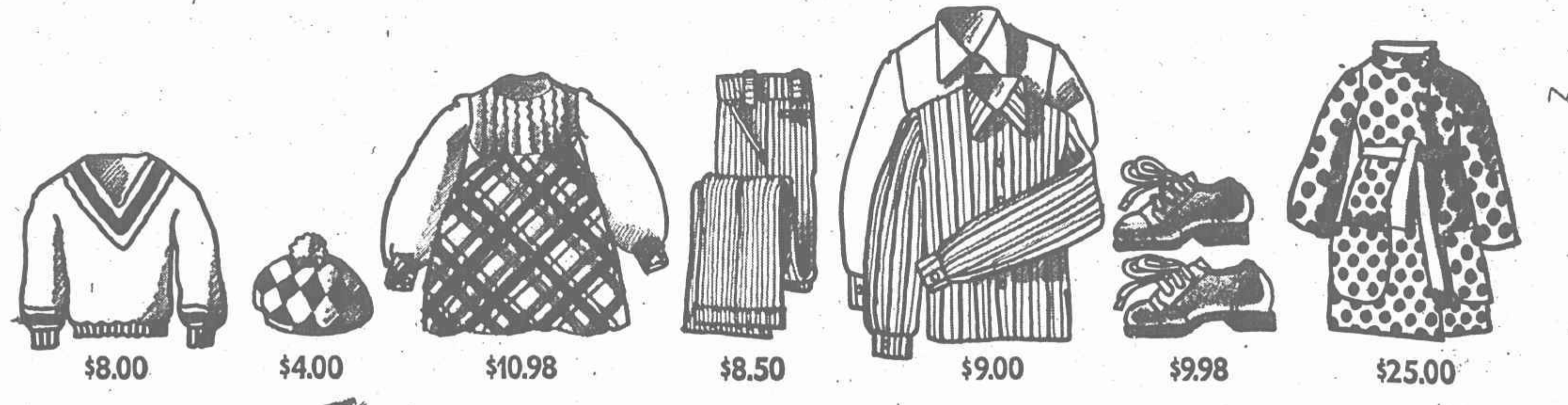
**Manufacturing Job Chances Are Declining**

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Labor Department says job opportunities in manufacturing are declining, especially in the instruments, machinery and electronic equipment industries.

The cutback in job openings was attributed to defense spending reductions and the general economic slowdown.

The bureau of Labor statistics and Manpower Administration said in a joint statement the total number of vacant jobs in manufacturing in June, 1970, was 123,000 as opposed to 240,000 a year earlier.
