WATER CONSUMPTION IN CARTHAGE IS VERY LARGE

FLOW FROM HEAD WATERS IS OVER 1,000,000 GALLONS A DAY

Carthage, March 15.—In an interview last evening, F. M. Wing, former superintendent of water works, gave some very interesting figures regarding the consumption of water in this village. The actual flow of water a day from the head water of the system is 1,020,000 gallons. The consumption by the New York Central, the Carthage steam mill, the West End mill and the Island mill, the largest consumers, is estimated at 1,192,544 gallons for six months or 281,377 gallons a day.

The actual flow of water a day from the head water of the system is 1,020,000 gallons. The consumption by the New York Central, the Carthage steam mill, the West End mill and the Island mill, the largest consumers, is estimated at 1,192,544 gallons for six months or 281,377 gallons a day.

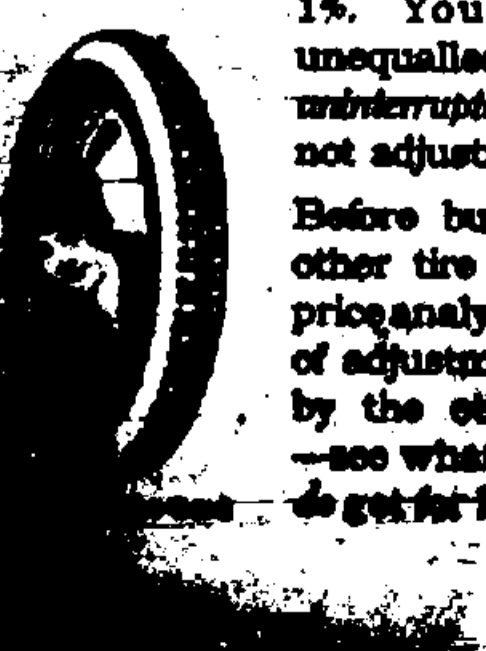

TROOPS BATTLING IN THE CARPATHIANS USING SKIS

Operations Hampered by Deep Snow

Germans Continue Attack at Przasnysz

Petrograd, (via London), March 14.—"The following official dispatch has been received from Odesa:

"The enemy has brought some of his batteries closer to the fortress because of their obvious inactivity at the longer range.

"Fighting at moderate distances continued throughout Sunday, and Monday with the advantage constantly with the defenders.

"Close to Odesa our scouts carried some of the enemy's positions and at nightfall sent prisoners back into the fortress.

Official reports from other fronts follow.

"Transylvania: The Germans treated a violent artillery race, but their infantry is unable to resist our attacks. We are holding the enemy on almost the entire front.

"Burgonia: The enemy is active at night, possibly reinforcing his artillery.

"The Carpathians: Conditions are extremely difficult for an offensive. Owing to the deep snow troops could be moved only slowly. The main offensive path is moving in the direction of the Carpathians, which involves heavy losses. Troops on both sides are using skis in spite of the conditions which exist. The Austrians continue their vain attempts to relieve Przasnysz, where our heavy batteries are active."
