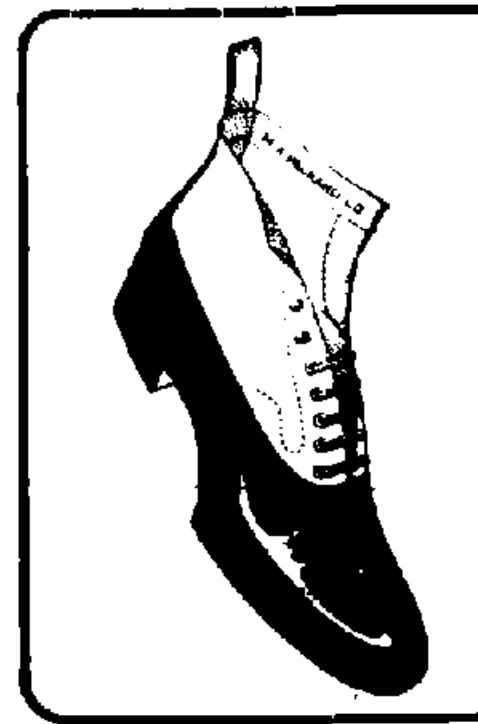

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WORKS AS A LABORER. HEIR TO MILLIONS TOILS WITH MECHANICS.

Charles H. Long, Son of Late Coal King, an Ambitious Man—Has Mastered Steel Industry and Is a Practical Banker.

Philadelphia. With a fortune in hand and a million in sight, Charles Hubert Long, son of the late coal king, Albert B. Long, is working as a laborer at the Baldwin locomotive works in Philadelphia.

Me Long to-day 22 years of age, has mastered every detail of the steel industry even beyond the point that his work has taken him, and is also a practical banker.

Covered from head to heel with soot and grease, Mr. Long quits his work with the 14,000 other employees of the Baldwin, and falling into step with the great black army of the ironworkers.
