BANKRUPTCY ACTION BEGUN AGAINST DANIEL F. STROBEL

Involuntary Petitions Filed Against One Time Powerful Political Leader.

Three creditors want Daniel F. Strobel, of Herkimer, one time powerful political leader in central New York, declared bankrupt. At the same time they ask that the West Canada Lumber Company, Herkimer and Basile T. Ecker, his business associate, be put into bankruptcy. The involuntary petitions were filed in federal court at Utica Saturday.

The petitioning creditors are the First Citizens Bank & Trust Company of Utica, First National Bank of Herkimer and the Citizens National Bank of Poland. They list claims for a total of over \$70,000.

These creditors charge that the three alleged bankrupts transferred a large amount of property to get it away from creditors, or to prefer certain creditors over others.

Daniel F. Strobel came out of the back woods of the Adirondacks 60 years ago and built up a power in politics which was recognized throughout the state. At the same time he built up a fortune out of lumber and other business enterprises. In his old age he lost his grip, it is said, and now represents the back woods town of Onia in the board of supervisors.

Women Do the Buying
A survey conducted through the Southwest by the Department of Commerce shows that women do 80 per cent of the buying of clothing and dry goods. They outrank men in that region by a ratio of four to one on the basis of dollars spent. It was found that at least 90 of each \$100 worth of business passing over the counters of department and dry goods stores during the year was directly dependent upon feminine taste and choice. The survey shows that 7 per cent of the total, while men's department and other house furnishings accounted for 18 per cent. Some 50 per cent of all sales represented purchases by the women for their own use. Allowing 3 per cent for miscellaneous buying, only 37 per cent of the dry goods volume could be attributed to purchases for men.
