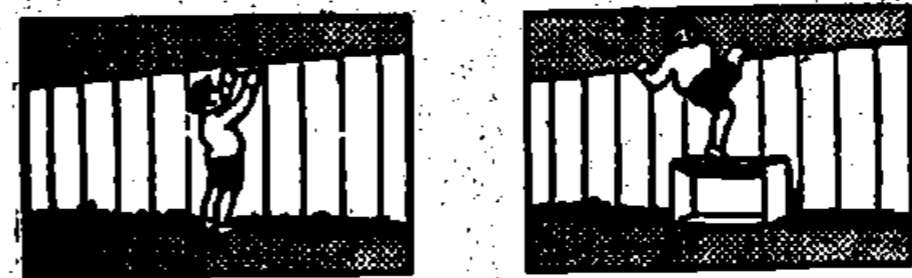

You may have outgrown your wiring, too!

BACK when your social obligations were confined to doll's tea parties, this chair was really something. But with the passing of the years, there's little question that you've outgrown it. Did it ever occur to you that your lights and appliances may have outgrown your house wiring?

You see, the wiring in your house was



probably designed for only half the appliances and lights that you use today . . . and the wiring has reached a point of overloading. Like a little boy trying to get over a high fence, it may need a boost. The danger signals are blowing fuses, irons that are slow to heat, lights that blink when other lights or appliances are turned on.

To be on the safe side, better call an electrician and have him check your fuses and wiring against overloading. If the wiring needs attention, he can easily put in heavier circuits or split up old ones.
