### Spring Cleaning Causes Home Accidents

Spring time is clean-up time, but watch out for "booby traps" in your home, especially if you are in the upper age brackets, warns Senator Thomas C. Desmond, of Orange County, Chairman of the Joint Legislative Committee on Problems of the Aging.

"Home accidents," Senator Desmond said, "last year injured more than 5,000,000 persons and brought death to about 35,000. More than half of those killed were older people, most of whom experienced falls.

"Tidying up is a spring season chore which holds many hazards for the elderly. Curtains and drapes are taken down and put up again, woodwork may need painting, storm windows give way to screens. The housewife climbs up on a chair, a stool or other furniture to aid her in her work. The man of the house may decide to do some outside painting or other jobs in which potential danger lurks.

"If you stand on chairs and stools," Senator Desmond concluded, "you may be inviting a broken leg or back. The rungs of a rickety ladder can be steps to a hospital. Oldsters may unduly exert themselves, especially if they happen to be slightly under par in health. Every home holds 'booby traps' for the unwary, so take it easy, watch your step, and help yourself live to a ripe and safe old age."

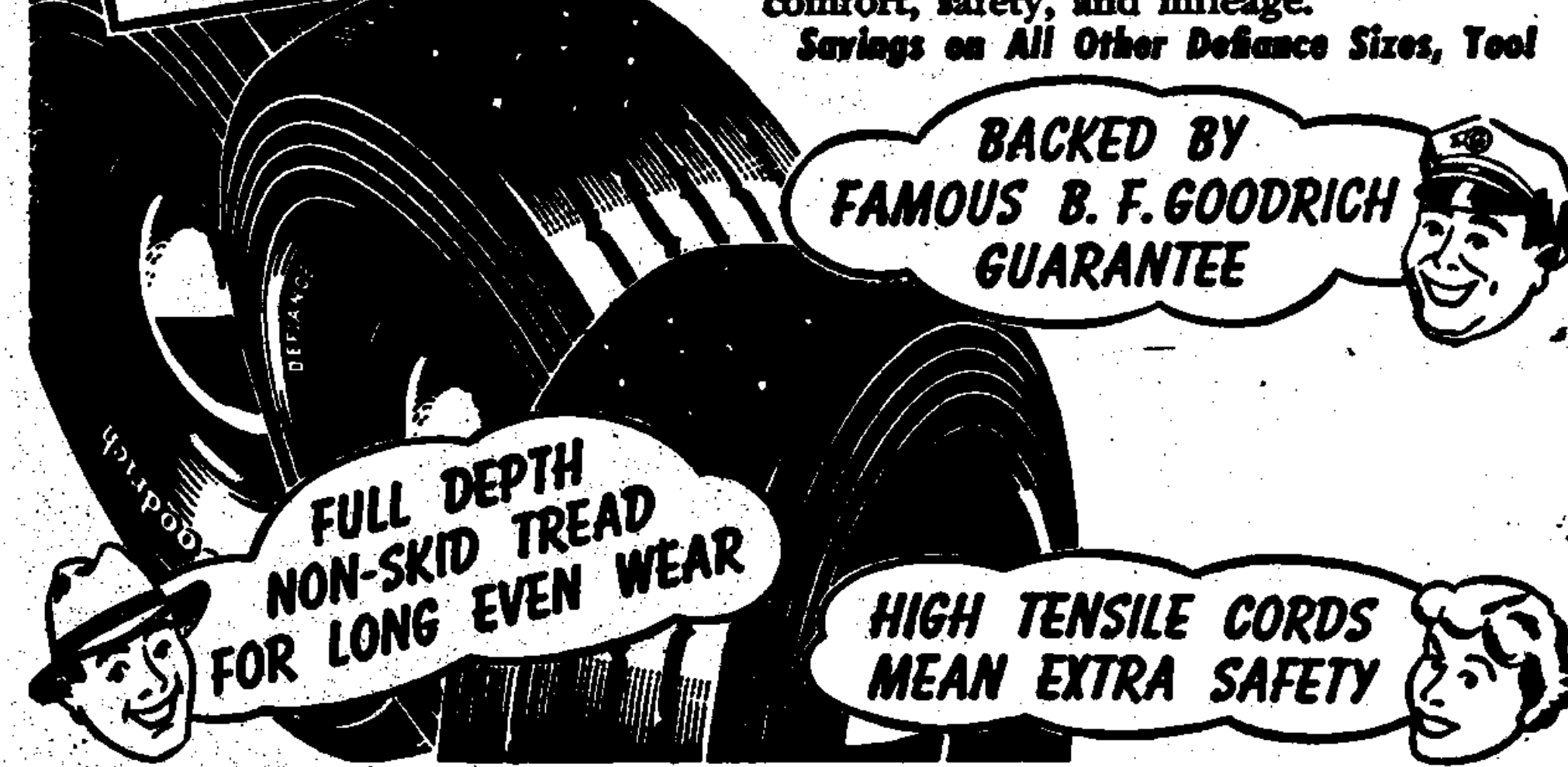
