This 1880 Armitage Hershell was found in a barn in 1955 and was fully restored by Harold Warp who founded the Pioneer Village. The original pegged music box still plays tunes as the animals go round and round. Early merry-go-rounds had roosters, pigs, giraffes, as well as horses but little tots were afraid of the others, so horses finally were the animal used.

### Make Inventory of Items in Home

If you had a fire in your home, would you be able to tell your insurance man just what items of contents were destroyed?

The American Insurance Association recommends that you make an inventory of your belongings.

To do this, the Association suggests you go through your house, making a list of each chair, table, and every other article of furniture. Opposite each, write the price you paid for it, or, if you cannot remember or do not know the price, put down a figure representing what you think its present value is.

This list can be made in duplicate. One copy should be placed with your fire insurance policy. The other you may give to your insurance man so that he will have it for his reference if you have a fire.

You should also itemize small items you may have in drawers, such as jewelry and watches. Don't overlook valuable apparel and items on shelves in boxes.

The item to be bid on will comply with the following general specifications:

The proposal should cover the proposition on the basis on when and if ordered by the District and should cover the period from September 1, 1967, to September 1, 1968, and shall be delivered price.

1. Gasoline and Motor Oil - this must state the unit price per gallon and the name of the gasoline and oil to be furnished. All gasoline shall be regular grade and furnished in bulk lots of not less than 500 gallons delivered at places to be designated by the District. All bidders will agree to furnish an electrically operated gas pump and a 2000 gallon underground tank for the use of the District for the duration of the contract.

2. Milk and Ice Cream  
a. Milk not more than 24 hours old at time of delivery, in half pint containers (if in glass bottles, a lip covering type of cap shall be used) and the milk and container shall otherwise meet all requirements and specifications of the New York State Public Health Laws and requirements of the New York State Agriculture and Market Law.

b. Milk in bulk for cooking as needed and meeting all health department standards.

It is anticipated that on days school is in session requirements will be about 700 half pints of white and 960 half pints of chocolate milk. All milk will be delivered by 8:00 A.M., at temperature not exceeding 38 degrees F and upon request deliveries shall be made at 11:30 A.M., and 12:30 P.M., and deliveries shall be into coolers as

### Four States Export Holsteins To Italy

A report from Holstein-Friesian Association of America lists Registered Holstein dairy herd owners who recently participated in an export sales transaction. The shipment included 49 females, all for a single buyer in Italy.

Selections and shipment coordination were handled by Hamilton Amoss, Jr., Fallston, Maryland; R. Austin Backus, Inc., Mexico, N.Y. and Outagamie Holstein Association, of Appleton, Wisconsin. The cattle came from 15 herds in Maryland, New York, Pennsylvania and Wisconsin.

The largest group of 23 animals, was selected from the herd of Ray H., Royd R. and Dorothy Marie Smith, of Frederick Maryland.

Another group of 11 animals came from Wisconsin herds owned by Robert Krohlow, Black Creek; Norman Burmeister, Bonduel; Robert Tauscher and Cl-

arence Vanderveren, both of Green Bay; Adolph Henn, Eugene Roepcke and Elwyn Staley, all of Seymour; M.E. Davis, Jr., and Robert and Beatrice C. Janssen, all of De Pere.

Six head from Pennsylvania were selected from the herds of Howard B. Weiss, Myerstown and May M. Moore, of Greencastle. Ellsworth C. Dunkle, King Ferry, New York, consigned eight animals to this shipment.

For the past two years, Holstein breeders in this country have sold more than 3,600 animals to herd owners outside the United States. In 1966, the national Holstein organization recorded official transfers to 25 different countries. Mexico, Italy, Peru, Venezuela and Canada were the largest volume buyers.

### Plan Membership Campaign In Fall

Boys will be invited to join the Boy Scouts of America as a part of the annual fall roundup, the membership campaign of the Oswego County Council, Arthur Coville, the roundup chairman, announced today.

The fall roundup is scheduled to be held between September 1st and December 15, but leaders of 92 Cub Scout packs, Boy Scout troops, and Explorer posts in this area have already started to make their plans for Scout unit participation in the membership program, Coville said.

8, 9, and 10 year old boys will be invited to join Cub Scout packs and boys 11 or older are eligible for Boy Scout troops. High school boys will have special opportunities to become Explorers, Coville said.

As part of the fall roundup program in the Oswego County Council, Scout units, boys, and leaders will be able to earn awards. These include "Recruiter Patch '67" for the Scout who recruits a new boy and the "Roundup Streamer '67" for the Unit that meets their goal.

"We expect that over 500 new Scouts will be enrolled during the fall roundup," Coville explained, "and these boys will have an opportunity to get in on the fun and adventure of Scouting as soon as they become Scouts."

Coville said that information about the location of Scout units in the Oswego County Council is available from the Scout service center, 208 W. First St., Oswego, 343-4382, and that parents whose sons want to be Scouts may ask for the names of institutions that use the Scout program in their areas.
