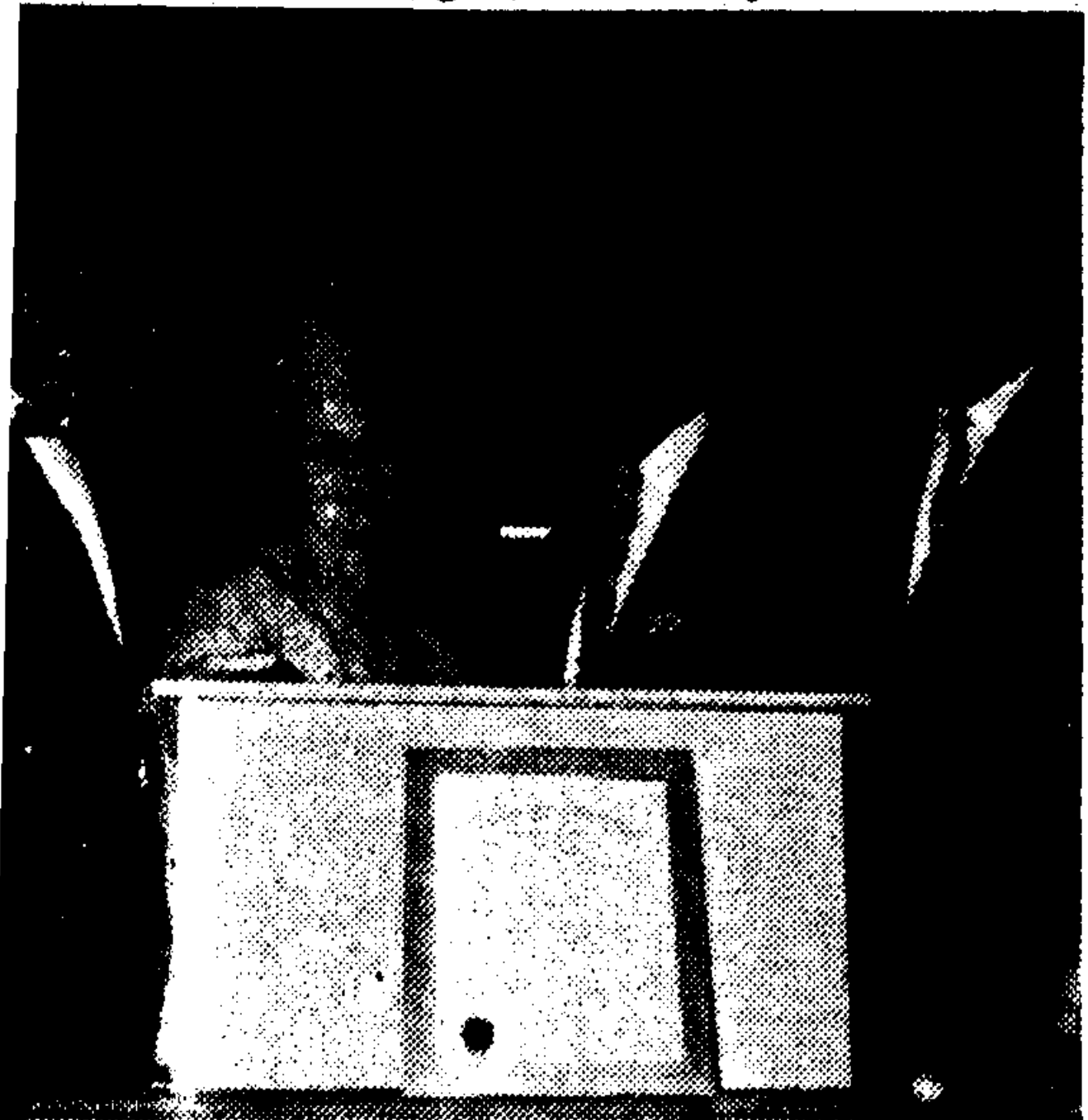
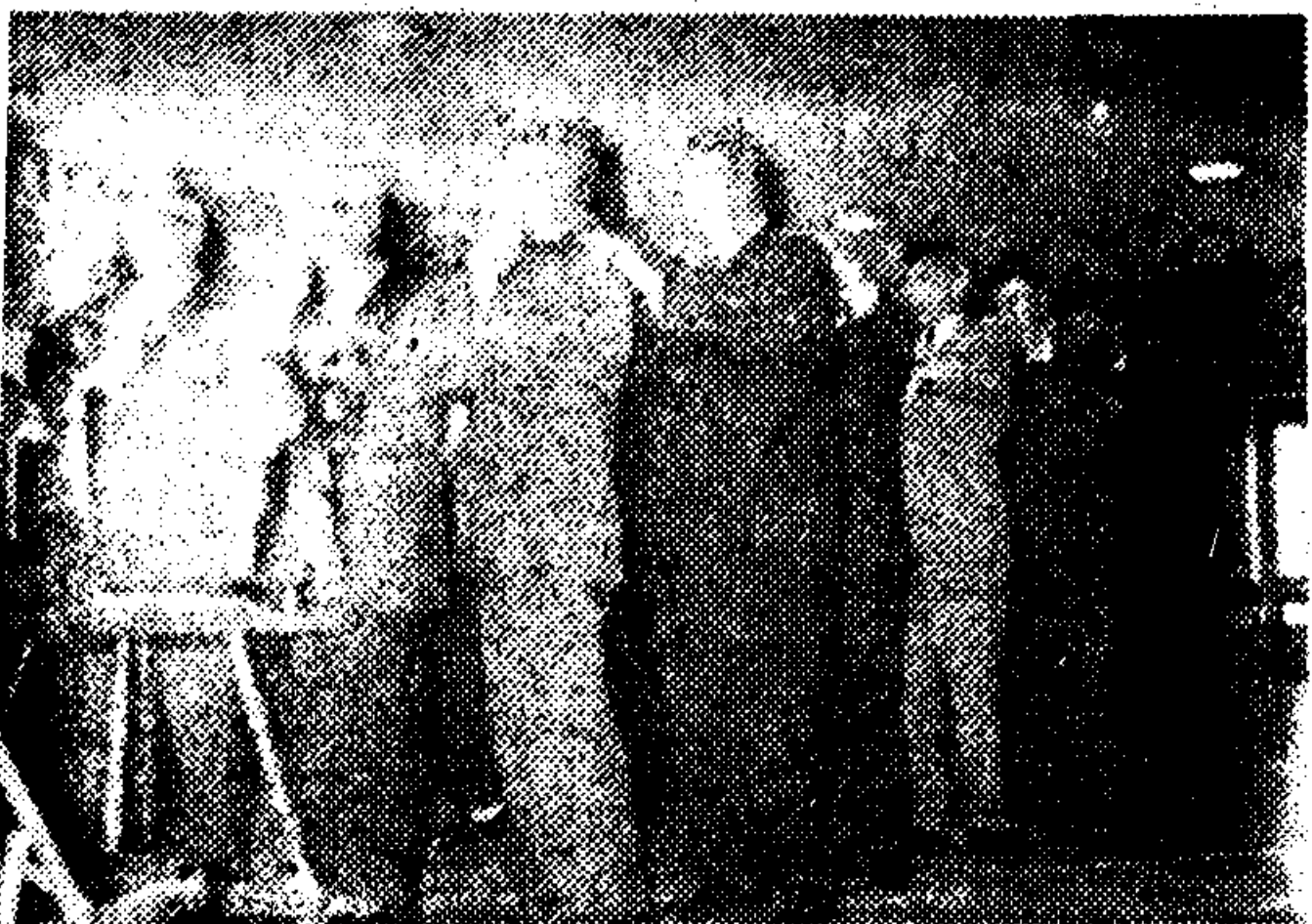


Constantia V.F.W. Hosts Oswego County Council
