The sign of subtraction was derived from the word "minus." The word was first contracted in m. n. s. with a horizontal line above to indicate that some of the letters had been left out.

The multiplication sign was obtained by changing the plus sign into the letter "x." This was done because multiplication is but a shorter form of addition.

Division was formerly indicated by placing the dividend above a horizontal line and the divisor below. In order to save space in printing the dividend was placed to the left and the divisor to the right.

The sign of equality was first used in the year 1557 by a sharp mathematician, who substituted it to avoid frequently repeating the words "equal to."

REWARD FOR ARREST.

Many Bodies Offer Bums For Apprehension of Policeman's Murderer.

Waterbury, Conn., March 10.—The board of public safety and the board of aldermen held meetings last night and the former recommended to the latter that a reward of \$200 be offered for the apprehension of the assassin of Policeman Mendelssohn.

These are not the only rewards offered. Magnolia Lodge, Knights of Pythias, has offered a reward of \$500 for the apprehension of the murderer and a like amount has been offered by Noshagan lodge, I. O. O. F. Mendelssohn was a member of both these fraternities.

The Connecticut Railway and Lighting company will also offer a substantial reward.

The striking employes of the companies at their daily meeting today will decide upon the amount of money they will offer for the apprehension of the murderers.

COLOMBIAN TREATY.

Senator Morgan Will Allow a Vote on His Remarks Can Be Printed.

Washington, March 10.—During the session of the committee on foreign relations Senator Morgan offered to consent to a vote on the Colombian canal treaty at 2 o'clock Saturday provided the senate would consent to allow him to print such remarks as he wanted in the Congressional Record or as a public document.

Members of the committee later discussed the proposition with other senators and the consensus of opinion seemed to be against granting the permission.

Some of the remarks herebefore made by Senator Morgan reflected rather severely on the Colombian government and especially on the president of Columbia, and senators think it would be inadvisable to give official sanction to such utterances by allowing them to appear in the records of the senate.

It also is feared that the Colombian government might take offense and fail to ratify the treaty and it is asserted that ratification of the treaty can be accomplished even if no agreement is reached.

Body Found on Wife's Grave.

Saratoga, March 10.—The body of Tracy A. Record was found on his wife's grave in Greenridge cemetery. He had shot himself. Despondency caused by business troubles is supposed to have been the cause of suicide.
