REDUCE WASTE OF FILTERED WATER

All persons using city water through hose will be required to pay for such water, regardless of whether hose is attached in kitchen or on outside tap. Refusal to pay the department's bill for hose use will be followed by shutting off the water supply from the premises offending.

All water for sprinkling must be drawn through hose held in the hand. Setting hose and allowing water to run to waste in large quantities is prohibited by law, and cannot be permitted unless at special rates.

All non-resident fishermen, by amendment recently enacted to the conservation law, are required to have a license before fishing in any waters within or on the boundary of this state.

Taxes are coming in at the city treasurer's office at the rate of about \$1,000 a day. Treasurer Hall has devised a plan of handling this business in a very efficient way and taxpayers are no longer annoyed by long waits.

A very encouraging report was made Monday evening at a meeting of members of the special finance committee appointed in connection with the campaign for funds for the erection of a Masonic temple and club house in this city.

Paul Wisner of Prescott will leave soon to go to the front for the allies. Mr. Wisner's elder brother, Lieutenant Henry J. Wisner is in camp at Rock-cliff, Canada, and will be ordered to the front very soon. Paul Wisner has joined the motor boat patrol.

An automobile driving through Ford street about 11 o'clock last night collided with one of the new steel "Turn to the Right" standards placed in position yesterday at the corner of Ford and Isabella streets. The top of the red traffic guide was bent.

A force of men are at work repairing the roadway leading up to the New York Central depot. The road will be paved with brick. The road was in bad condition from the heavy traffic at this point and the pawing of horses during the wait for trains.

An agitation is on foot for a movement to petition the Ontario Government to begin work at once on a "Good Road" between Prescott and Belleville on the main highway between Toronto and Montreal and passing through Brockville, Gananoque, Kingston, Napanee and Belleville.

Edward C. Ritchie was appointed a fireman-laborer and James Curbeau a laborer for the customs house here yesterday. The appointments were made from the federal civil service list and the addition of an extra man will permit of eight hour shifts for three men and will assure one of the men being on duty all the time.
