S. W. Day, special inspector for the United States treasury department, has found many motor boats at Clayton lacking in the equipment required by the government regulations. Mr. Day is making the tour of the St. Lawrence river and Lake Ontario ports.

Officials of the St. Lawrence division of the New York Central believe that there will be no strike of the four brotherhoods made up of employees in the operating department, but should there be a strike the division and the entire railroad will be tied up, they say, and no effort has been made to prepare for it.

Word has been received here of the death of Robert A. Kelley, formerly of Ogdensburg, who succumbed shortly after an operation for appendicitis in a hospital at Fargo, S. D. Mr. Kelley conducted a large general store at Kloten, N. D., and went from there to Fargo for medical attention. The remains were taken to Kloten for interment.

Dr. P. G. Taddikon, assistant superintendent of the St. Lawrence state hospital, consulted with ten patients at a mental clinic at Watertown yesterday. Among the cases at the clinic were former patients, while there were several new patients. Dr. Taddikon is an expert in mental diseases, and is assisting Dr. Richard H. Hutchings, superintendent of the St. Lawrence State hospital, to carry on the work in the various cities in this locality.

The Watertown office of the highway department received word yesterday that the Ogdensburg-Canton state road was in poor condition and advising automobilists to detour. The road has been closed for repairs but it has not been barricaded. The road is narrow and dangerous, especially at night. Automobilists going from Watertown to Ogdensburg are advised to leave the state road at old Dekalb and cut over through Rensselaer Falls and Houvelton to Ogdensburg, instead of going to Ogdensburg and then making a detour.
