

No Buzzer Beater This Time For Syracuse

PHILADELPHIA (UPI)—Dwayne McClain scored 18 points, including the game-winning jumper with four seconds remaining Sunday, to lead Villanova to a 77-75 Big East Conference victory over 12th-ranked Syracuse.

The Wildcats, winning for the eighth time in their last nine games and 10-8 overall, held the ball for the last shot over the Orangemen's Greg Monroe who hit a jumper with 52 seconds remaining to tie the score at 75-75. Villanova worked the ball around before McClain fired a 15-foot jumper from the left wing over two defenders for the victory.

The Orangemen, 14-5, trailed 73-67 with 3:58

remaining out freshman Dwayne Washington hit a three-point play, a free throw and a 10-foot bank shot to tie the score 73-73 with 1:40 left to play. The Wildcats, who missed the front ends of three one-and-ones during this stretch, regained the lead on two free throws by Ed Pinckney with 1:14 remaining but Syracuse tied it on Monroe's basket.

McClain, who shot 9-of-11 from the field, was joined in double figures by Pinckney with 16, Gary McLain with 14, Frank Dobbs with 13 and Harold Pressley with 12. Washington led all scorers with 27 points and teammate Wendell Alexis added 21.

Villanova sank 10 of its first 12 shots - including

four straight by McClain - to take a 22-13 lead with 11:08 left in the first half. Trailing 24-15, the Orangemen scored eight consecutive points, six by Washington, and eventually took their first lead at 29-28 with 3:53 remaining.

Pinckney scored his team's final five points of the half to give Villanova a 39-38 halftime lead. The Wildcats ripped off seven straight points early in the second half to take a 46-40 lead and never trailed again, although the Orangemen never let Villanova gain full control.

The victory boosted the Wildcats' record in the Big East to 7-2 while Syracuse slipped to 8-2.

Crusaders Manage Two Point Win Over Panthers

OSWEGO-Bishop Cunningham's basketball Crusaders were able to hold off a last minute surge by Port Byron Friday as the Crusaders used two free throws by Jeff Baker with two seconds left in the game to post a 50-48 victory.

BC started off strong as the game opened, jumping out to an 8-2 lead only three minutes into the contest. The Crusaders took advantage on the outside

shooting of junior Jeff Baker (22 points) and Kevin Broderick (14 points) who combined for 12 first quarter points.

BC also used a swift moving fast break in the early going, off defensive rebounds by Dave Proud and Paul Familo to give the Crusaders a 14-8 edge at the end of one.

As the second period started Port Byron came alive with two quick buckets to cut the Crusader lead 14-12 at the 6:45 mark. Shortly after, BC received their first

hoop of the quarter on a jumper from Broderick to get BC started.

P-B returned with an inside score from Biracusa (23 points) and BC's lead was cut again. After a fast break layup by junior guard Pat Cahill, and another Baker jumper, the Crusaders opened up a 20-14 margin with 4:00 to go in the half.

P-B didn't give up as the Panthers started to score from inside the paint and managed to lock the score up 22 all toward the end of the quarter. A Baker jumper and an inside bucket by Stan Wengzyn after a strong rebound, put BC on top 28-22 as the first half came to a close.

A quick moving third period began with a BC score from Eric Croucher. The Crusaders controlled the quarter with good defense and effective perimeter shooting from their guards.

Once again P-B would come back with inside post up buckets by Siracusa and McMahon (15 points) to soften the Crusader lead 36-34 at the end of the period.

BC maintained their lead throughout the first three minutes of the final stanza only to see P-B claw back once more to pull within one 41-40 at the 4:30 mark. A three point play by Siracusa allowed the Panthers to take the lead for the first time all evening. BC quickly closed the gap to one as Proud hit both ends of a 1-1 to make it 43-42 P-B with 3:15 to play.

Another inside bucket by Siracusa put P-B up three, but Kevin Broderick cut it to one with a crucial jumper. Port Byron's next possession culminated with an inside score which gave the Panthers a three point edge. A long jumper from a silent Familo pulled BC to within one. Seconds later, a P-B turnover resulted in a breakaway layup for Broderick which put the Crusaders on top 48-47 with only 1:37 remaining.

Port Byro managed to tie it up at 48 on the front end of a 1-1 with little time left. In the Crusaders final possession, the ball ended up in Bakers hands, P-B fouled and Baker was at the line with :02 to go. Baker hit both attempts on the 1-1 to ice a 50-48 win at home for the Crusaders.

BC travels to Cato Wednesday for a key South matchup.
