FRUIT TRAIN A BIG SUCCESS

Thousands in Oswego District Visited It.

Superintendent McCormack Says That the Demand for Young Apple Trees Has Exhausted the Supply of Nurseries—New York Can Beat the West in Raising Fruit.

Superintendent F. E. McCormack, of the Ontario Division of the New York Central, returned last night from a trip to the fruit train to Suspension Bridge.

The fruit train was expected in Geneva today. Mr. McCormack said this morning that about three thousand people had visited the train between here and Rochester and that from thirty-eight hundred to four thousand fruit growers and buyers visited the train between Rochester and the bridge.

Mr. McCormack also said that the general freight business on the division during the month of November was very good, there being an increase of 5,000 cars over the number handled on the division in November of 1908.

He said that this increase was not due to any one thing, but an increase in all kinds of business.
