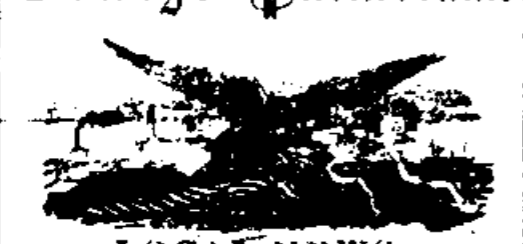

Latest News!

Mr. Fessenden interested. August 6, Jan. 11. Hon. Wm. Pitt Fessenden was to-day re-elected U. S. Senator from Maine for six years from the 4th of March next.

From California. New York, Jan. 12. The steamer Moser Taylor arrived at midnight from Apollon 3rd inst. She brings nearly \$1,400,000 in treasure and about 200 passengers.

The most important news are already received via New Orleans. Edward Tulloch, an editor and poet of some merit, died at San Francisco on the 13th inst. He was a native of Philadelphia.

The gold exports from San Francisco for the year, to December 30, were nearly \$48,000,000.

George Penn Johnson, indicted for killing M. F. Ferguson in a duel, had been acquitted.

The weather has been cold, and snow has fallen in some places to the depth of 3 feet. Mining at Fraser River is improving, but the weather is very inclement and provisions scarce and dear.

Gov. Douglas has authorized a levy of duty on certain goods imported into Columbia. The loss by the recent fire at Valparaiso is estimated at \$3,000,000.

Bolivia was quiet. A minister had been sent to London on urgent business.

Congressional. Washington, Jan. 11. Mr. Johnson, of Tenn., said he would call up the Homestead bill at an early day.

The Pacific Railroad bill coming up, Mr. Gwin expressed a hope that the final vote would be taken on Thursday next.

Mr. Wilson had the floor. He spoke at length in favor of the central road to the Pacific, having its terminus at St. Louis and San Francisco, and argued that it should be built at the expense of the government.

Without disposing of the subject, the Senate adjourned; so the bill comes up first in the regular order of business to-morrow.

The House resumed the consideration of the motion of Mr. Stephens, of Ohio, to refer the Naval Appropriation bill to the Committee of the Whole on the state of the Union.

Without coming to any conclusion on the subject, the House adjourned.
