SAME TREATMENT FOR ALL. Rich men who violate the Federal statutes can not expect leniency from President Taft.

Rich men who violate the Federal statutes can not expect leniency from President Taft. He made this fact most evident yesterday when he refused to commute the prison sentence imposed upon W. T. Harris, head of the great lumber interests in Florida and Alabama, convicted of poisoning.

Powerful influences worked upon the President to get him to save Harris from going behind the prison bars, after the conviction of the lower courts had been sustained by the United States Supreme Court, but without avail.

To retain and enforce the imprisonment part of the sentence will operate powerfully to prevent a recurrence of such offenses by men of large affairs and business standing.

The officials of the Beef Trust, the meat and other trusts, which are under indictment in the Federal Courts, have had to fear the outcome of their trials.
