Oshawa Strikers Refuse Shorter Hours, Higher Pay Unless CIO Recognized

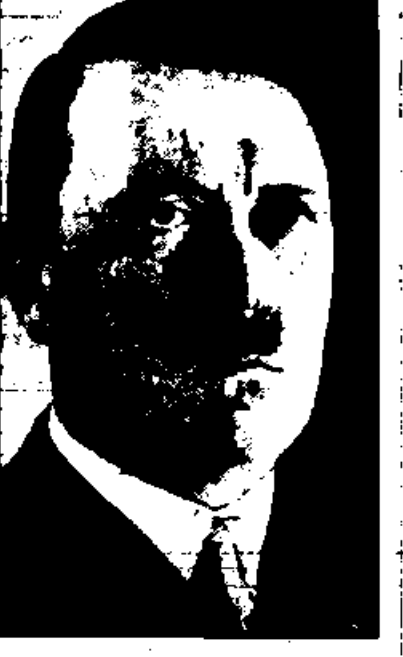

Britain Boosts Income Tax to Pay Arms' Cost

Rearmament Budget of Chamberlain Indicates Surplus of \$1,260,000,000

LONDON, April 20 (AP)—Chancellor of the Exchequer, Neville Chamberlain introduced Great Britain's first "rearmament budget" today with the unwelcome news of an increase in the standard income tax rate to 25 per cent, but with a prospective surplus of \$1,260,000,000.

The budget which Chamberlain drew from his historic, carefully guarded red dispatch box estimated the nation's 1937-38 revenue at \$63,100,000,000 sterling, and expenditures at \$62,848,000,000 sterling, for a 252,000,000 pound surplus.
