Administration Optimistic Its Energy Policies Can Minimize Worker Layoffs

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS — The administration is optimistic its energy policies can minimize the loss of jobs because of the fuel shortage. But the toll continues, with new layoffs affecting thousands of workers in the automobile and aviation industries. "There are some difficult days ahead on unemployment," one government economist said Wednesday. He predicted the jobless rate would rise from its present 4.5 per cent but would fall short of the 6 per cent rate forecast widely by private economists.

Warmer Weather Than Usual Is Forecast for Many U. S. Areas

WASHINGTON (AP) — Only in the Far West, the Northern Rockies and the Northern Great Plains is the outlook for a colder winter than normal. The National Weather Service said its outlook has a 60 per cent chance of being correct. The weather service said its 30-day outlook was based on experimental forecasts prepared four times a year for the past 15 years.
