WELCOME REV. SCOTT TO PULASKI CHARGE

Successor to Rev. C. T. Holcombe Community Center Function

PULASKI, May 3.-Rev. Ernest H. Scott and his family, which includes Mrs. Scott and their daughter, Miss Jessie Scott, were tendered a reception Friday night at Meacham Community Center, Inc., North street. The new minister was recently assigned to this charge by the Northern New York conference to succeed Rev. Charles T. Holcombe as pastor of the First Methodist Episcopal church.

The Community Center was thronged all evening by the members of the church and congregation. Rev. Winfield S. Warren, pastor of First Baptist church, Rev. William MacArthur, pastor of First Congregational church, Rev. Ray Wootton, rector of St. James' Episcopal church, and others joined in welcoming the new pastor and his family, which includes Mrs. Scott and their daughter, Miss Jessie Scott.

The affair was entirely informal. An entertaining musical program was presented during the evening by the young ladies of the church. Refreshments were served during the evening. Members of Ladies' Aid society, at the head of which is Mrs. Ward B. Parkhurst, arranged the details for the reception, and also served as reception committee, which included Mrs. Eliza Holmes, Mr. and Mrs. Simon R. Trumbull and Mr. and Mrs. D. Ward Howard.

Prior to coming to Pulaski last month Mr. Scott had for six years been pastor of Centenary Methodist Episcopal church at Utica. Before going to that city he had for eight and one-half years been pastor of Calvary church at Rome.

The local church is one of the most prominent, outside of the cities, included in Ontario district. During the pastorate of Mr. Holcombe, the membership of the society was more than 200. He had officiated at over 100 weddings and 300 funerals. A handsome parsonage, also erected during his pastorate, cost \$3,500 at a time when building material was much lower than at present time. Improvements totaling \$6,500 were made to the edifice during that period, and a pipe organ installed, which cost \$5,500. During the past three years the salary of the pastor has been \$2,300.

Russian Found in Road Facing County Clerk's Office Early This Morning

After 12 hours freedom, Nicholas Comsavliski, 25, who escaped from the Oswego county jail farm yesterday afternoon, was arrested by local police at 2 o'clock this morning. Comsavliski, a Russian who is serving a three-months jail term for vagrancy, was at work picking stone on the farm when he made his escape. He was discovered by Patrolman Howley of the police force early this morning. Officer Howley saw a man walking up and down in the road in front of the County Clerk's building, and brought him in to the City Hall jail. He was later identified as the jail-breaker.

Comsavliski, jail officials say, was with other prisoners under direction of Lee Summerville, superintendent of the jail farm, when he made his escape. Early in the afternoon, he was helping Mr. Summerville move a large rock. The superintendent got down behind the boulder to hook it up so that the team could haul it away. When he got up again, the prisoner had disappeared.

A posse of 20 men in charge of Sheriff Rock S. Vincent searched the vicinity all afternoon and part of the evening. They scoured the woods nearby in the belief that Comsavliski was hiding there, but the search was unsuccessful, and was abandoned at about 8 o'clock in the evening.

It was learned later that Mr. Lathrop, who is employed in a west side garage, was driving past the jail yesterday afternoon about the time of the escape, when he was halted by a man who asked for a lift downtown. He picked the stranger up, not suspecting his identity, and gave him a ride into the city. It is believed that this was the Russian.

This morning about 2 o'clock Patrolman Howley saw the man in front of the County Clerk's office and brought him in. He was later turned over to the officials of the county jail.

The sheriff has been investigating the man's case. He was picked up for vagrancy in Constantin a few days ago, and was convicted and sentenced before Justice of the Peace Deans of that place. He is said to have been in this country only three months. Comsavliski claims that he paid the sum of \$47 to be brought into this country from Canada. He speaks little English, and officials have had difficulty in getting his story.

Investigation of his record in New York city and Buffalo is being carried ahead and if Sheriff Vincent finds that the man was smuggled into this country he will be turned over to the immigration officials and deported into Canada when his term in the county jail is concluded.
