"I'm not going to take my politics and my opinions from Uncle Jack Burleson, nor pot for all his hog-wallow prairie, and his cattle and gold thrown in."

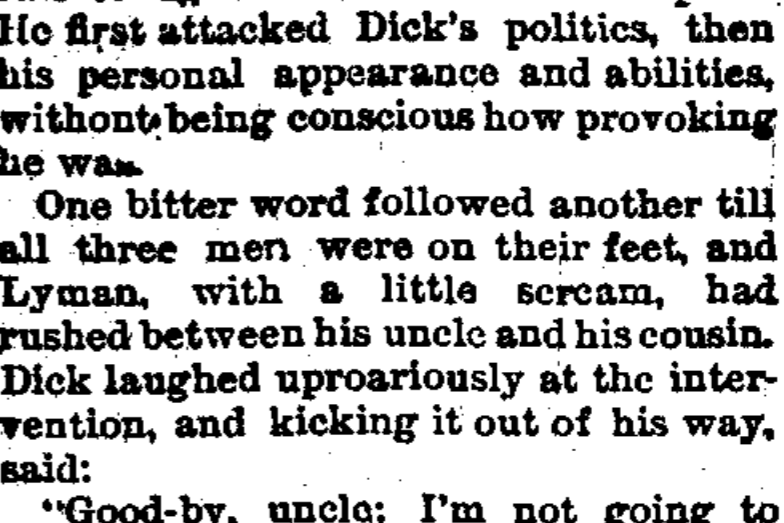
"He is an old man, Dick. Life is a country Jack Burleson has gone pretty thoroughly over; stands to reason he knows more'n you."
