CONGRESSMAN KNAPP

Expresses the Belief That the Republican Party Will Be Successful.

A RECORD TO STAND ON.

Last Session of Congress One of the Most Important in the History of the Country—President Roosevelt and Congress Will Solve Trust Question.

To day Syracuse Post-Standard has an interesting interview with Congressman Charles L. Knapp who was in Syracuse yesterday. Mr. Knapp expresses the vigorous belief that the success of the Republican party is assured at the coming fall elections.

Mr. Knapp declares in no uncertain terms that in State and Nation his party has a record it can stand on and win. He states that Cuban reciprocity is sure to come within the next two years.

"You may say for me," said Mr. Knapp to a Post-Standard reporter last night, "that I believe there is no question but that the Republican National Convention of 1904 will nominate Theodore Roosevelt to succeed himself as President and that

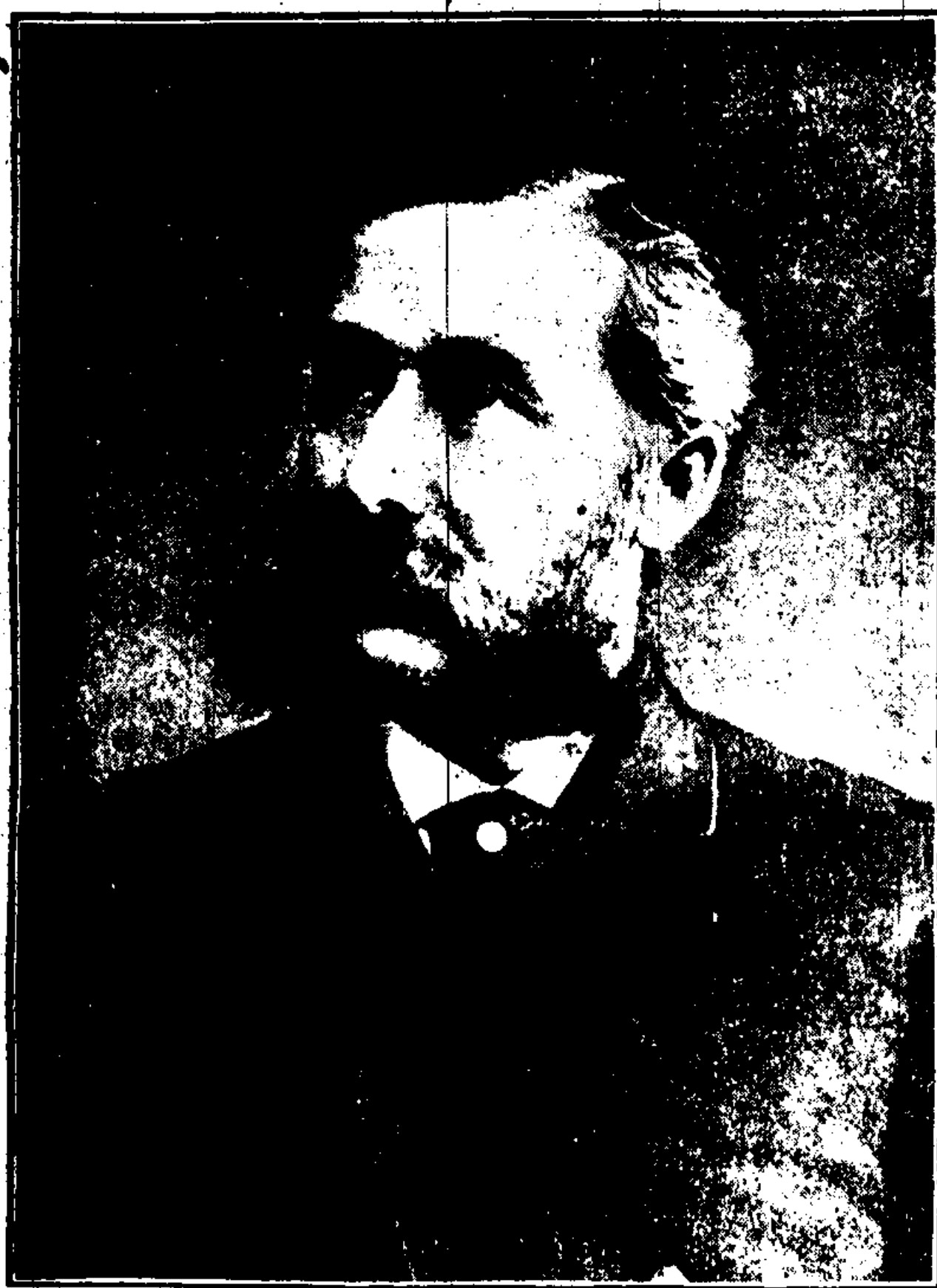
the difficult trust problem. Mr. Roosevelt began a sane fight on trusts as Governor.

"His watchword has been 'publicity.' Throw open the books of the combinations and in my opinion the people will be safe from unlawful depredations from trusts. Publicity is the keynote of rational and successful trust control."

Pilgrimage to Ste. Anne de Beaupre. Arrangements are progressing satisfactorily for the pilgrimage to the Shrine of Ste. Anne de Beaupre which leaves Oswego next Tuesday. Rev. Father Auger under whose management the pilgrimage is to be held expects that quite a number will attend from Oswego.

Goes to Gloversville. The New York Outfitting Company has been incorporated at Albany with a capital stock of \$20,000. The directors named are Michael T. Kinane, Oswego, N. Y.; George Munson, New York; and George B. Massey, Watertown. Gloversville, Fulton County, is named as the principal office of the company which will do a general dry goods business. the unmistakable confidence in which he is held by the American people makes his election equally certain. Mr. Roosevelt is an ideal Chief Magistrate. His strength in all quarters of the Union is increasing every day.

Next Congress Will Be Republican. "I am confident that we will again secure a majority in the House of Representatives. We may lose a few members in the West. These losses will be offset by gains in the East.

Governor Odell will be renominated and re-elected. He will go before the people with his magnificent record at Albany as an unanswerable argument for his retention in the Governor's chair. That record has been unequalled in a generation.

The session of Congress just closed was one of the most important in the history of our country. We have kept our pledge with Cuba and established it as an independent nation.

Porto Rico and the Philippines through force of events were made dependencies of the United States. This session was notable in that it passed the civil government act for the Philippines and the Philippines tariff bill. The Islands are practically pacified and the American government has fulfilled its promise to establish a stable and orderly condition of affairs there.

Wiped Out War Revenue Tax. "It is true that reciprocity with Cuba was not secured. This was due to complex present conditions. Reciprocity has not failed, it has only been postponed. It is sure to come within the next two years in one of two ways: either by the act of Congress or by a treaty between the two nations signed by the President and ratified by the Senate.

The last session wiped out the war revenue tax created by the Spanish-American war. Slowly and conservatively, but surely, all the new problems created by that national emergency are being solved and the conditions it made inevitable placed on a normal basis.

Since 1886 the farmers of the country have demanded an adequate oleomargarine bill. The last Congress gave it to them.
