Oswego coal dealers report that the orders are coming in rapidly for coal at June prices. The people realize that though the present price is 30 cents advance over the June price last year they must either pay it or submit to a still further increase later on. The dealers are using every possible means of acquainting the public with the present prices in order to stimulate the placing of orders. It is believed that more than one-half the winter supply of coal in Oswego will be ordered this month. The consumer has no other alternative but to pay the present prices or wait until fall and see the price climb.

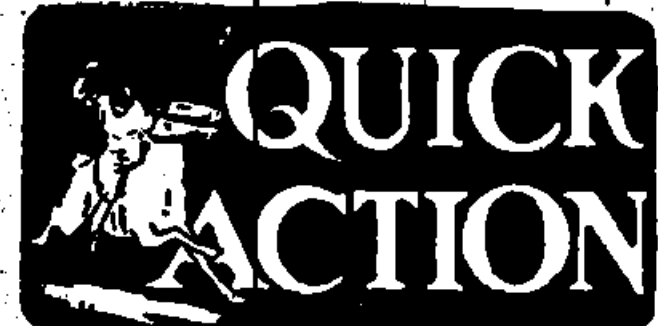
