Ramadoll offered a fervent prayer for the prosperity and success of the new church. The advent of the Baptist clergy into this community was a God send, as the influence of their work, thus far, has been a wonderful power for good, with bright prospects ahead for a continued successful victory for God. The services of the Rev. J. A. Heath will be secured for the ensuing year.
