SEIZURE OF DISTILLING PLANT

Casper, Commissioner of Internal Revenue, issued formal instructions to Collector P. L. Goldborough, at Baltimore, to seize the Carroll Springs Distillery Company's plant.

PRESIDENT AT A BALL GAME

Sat Side, by Side with Vice-President Sherman. Washington, April 21.—The national game received official sanction here when, for the first time in the memory of man, the President and Vice-President of the United States sat together in a grandstand box and rooted for the Washington team against the Boston.

KENILWORTH INN IN RUINS

Guests Escape from Burning Hotel Near Asheville. Asheville, N. C., April 19.—Rushes from their slumbers after 3 o'clock on an alarm of fire the seventy-five guests of the fashionable Kenilworth Inn, three miles from this city, barely had time to do some scanty articles of clothing and make their escape from the burning building.

MASSACRE IN PERSIA.

Turcomans Butcher 2000 in Astrabad—Women and Children Killed. St. Petersburg, April 21.—The Russian Telegrams Agency has received from Astrabad a dispatch stating that the Turcomans after defeating the revolutionists at Astrabad, near the coast of the Caspian Sea, massacred 2,000 persons, including many women and children.

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
