Whatever be the result of the negotiations just opened at Vienna, the intentions of the Russian Government are more clearly ascertained by the Allied Powers than will have the effect of suspending the operations of war, although successful operations of war may have the effect of accelerating the negotiations.

THE HOOSIC TUNNEL.—A Company consisting of Messrs. Applewall of New York, Erastus Corning of Albany, and others, have concluded to make the Hoosic Tunnel for \$3,500,000. They take stock to the amount of \$1,000,000, the State loan authorized by the Legislature of Massachusetts for \$2,000,000 and furnish \$400,000 themselves leaving the Troy and Greenfield Railroad Company to raise \$250,000. It is said, there is considerable feeling at Troy among the friends of the proposed tunnel road, in consequence of an attempt which is being made to cross the Hudson River at a point some twenty miles above that city, instead of crossing in Troy, as would certainly seem most practicable, in order to enlist the capital and business of that place. The only argument in favor of crossing above Troy is that it will shorten the distance and time between Boston and Oswego. Boston would probably prefer the shortest route, and to pass the Hudson above Troy, so as to avoid any connection with the Hudson river road. The influence west of the Hudson, will doubtless be in favor of crossing at Troy.

SENATE.—Petition from Auburn, granting military associations and the enrollment of foreigners in the militia. Bills were reported to prohibit the sale of Patent Office records to insane convicts. Notice was given of bills to regulate the number of ballot boxes in N. Y.; to incorporate the American Political Statistical Association, and relative to the Buffalo and Corning railroad. The concurrent resolution relative to Hudson River improvement was further debated and laid aside. The bill to incorporate the trustees of the Church of the Presbyterians Church was passed in Committee, with a strict proviso against ecclesiastical tenures and limiting the value of property to be held at \$250,000. The bills to amend the charter of the Panama railway, and to locate a second State Lunatic Asylum were ordered to a third reading. A subject concerning the resignation of Messrs. Dickinson, Danforth and Pratt, to investigate the charges against the Superintendent of section 1st Erie Canal.
