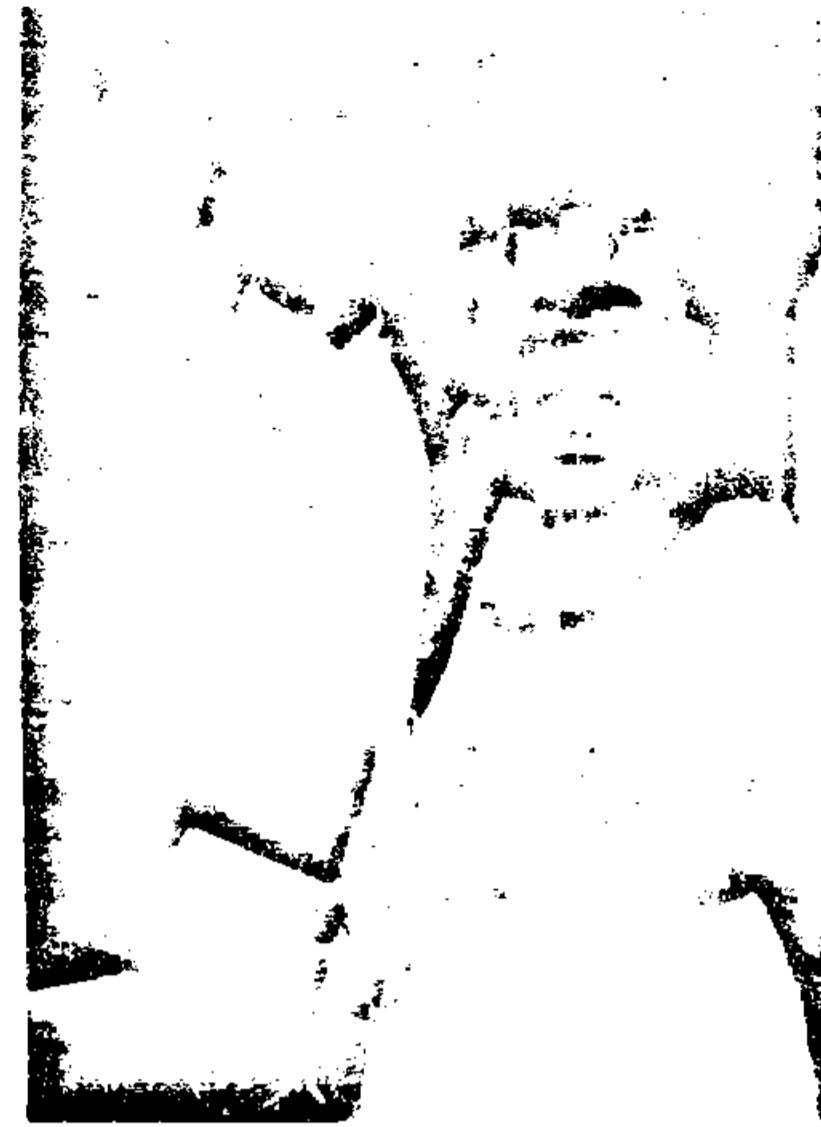


## Recent brides

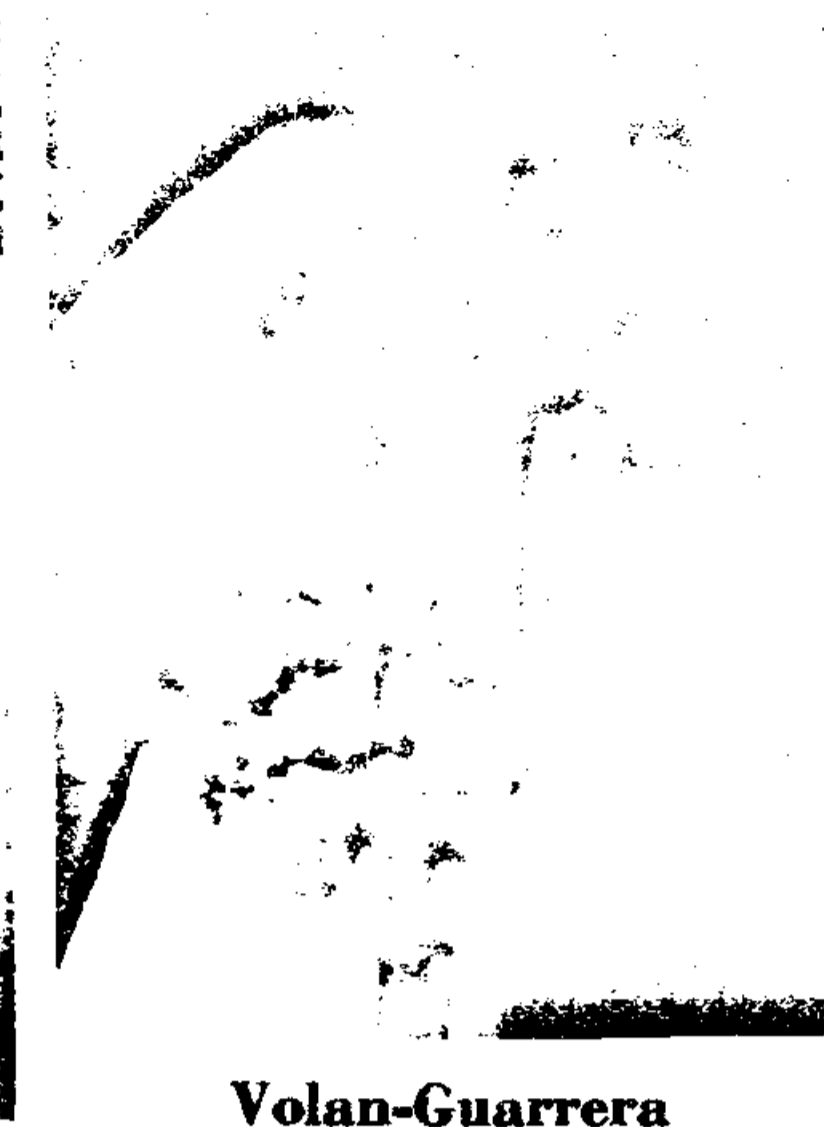

The bride is a graduate of Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario. She is a master's candidate at Harvard University.

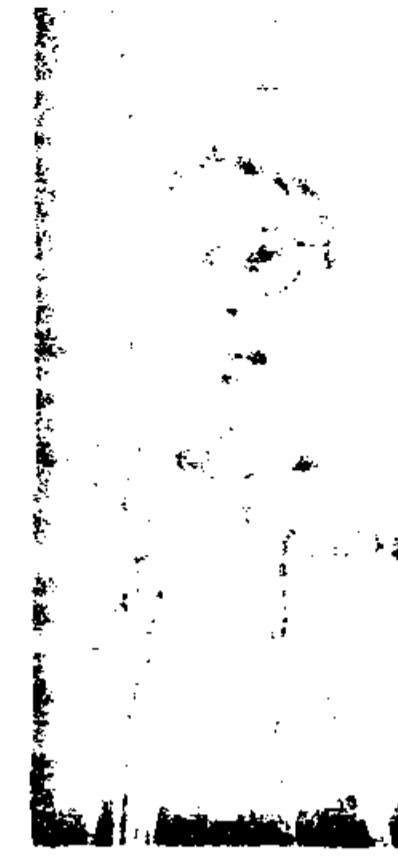
The bridegroom is a graduate of Northwestern University. He is employed by Raytheon Corporation, Tewksbury, Mass., as a computer systems specialist.

## Batteries sent for tone alert radios

George W. Brower, director of the Oswego County Emergency Management Office, has announced that replacement batteries have been mailed to county residents who received emergency planning tone alert radios.

Replacement batteries are mailed to residents on an annual basis to ensure proper operation of these radios. This mailing is a portion of the on-going maintenance program sponsored by the Emergency Management Office in conjunction with Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation and the New York Power Authority to allow for prompt notification during an emergency. Any resident who currently has a tone alert radio and has not received a new battery by Nov. 26 should contact the Emergency Management Office.

37 sirens, tone alert radios and the Emergency Broadcast System (EBS).

Brower stressed that upon hearing either the siren or tone alert radio signal residents should tune their AM/FM radios to any local Emergency Broadcast System (EBS) station for further information and instructions. EBS stations are listed in the booklet, "Oswego County Emergency Planning and You," booklet, the yellow pages of the telephone book and on posters placed in public areas.

Any resident who has a question concerning any aspect of emergency planning should call the Emergency Management Office at 1-800-965-2792.
