

# UR acquires second home for rehabilitation

Mrs. Eleanor Wilhelm, Urban Renewal Director, received approval at last week's meeting for the acquiring of the Baldwin property at 510 Academy Street for rehabilitation and resale in the Residential Rehabilitation Program under Federal Community Development (CDA) funding.

A \$6,500 purchase offer has been accepted by the estate contingent upon the city's waiving the back taxes on the property, approval of a Surrogate Court, and the payment of \$500 to Charles Baldwin for maintenance work.

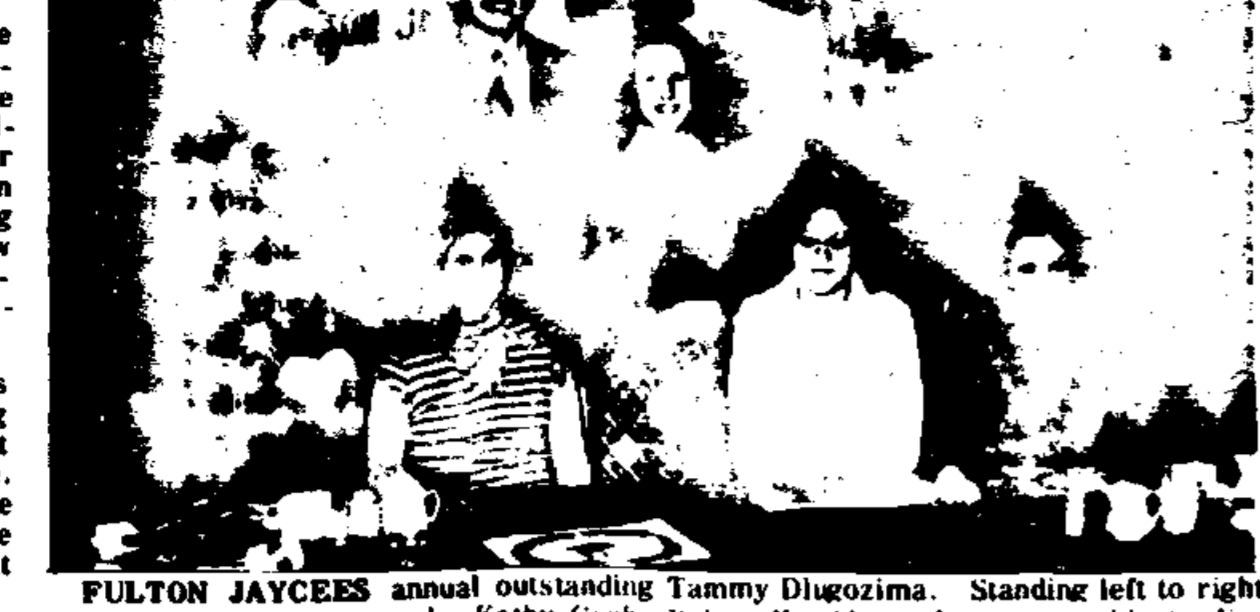
This will be the second house acquired under the program, the other at 213 South Second Street, on which rehabilitation work is nearing completion.

Mrs. Wilhelm also reported 43 grants or loans have been approved for rehabilitation of homes of low-income families, which cannot exceed \$5,000 per home, again under a \$200,000 home improvement incentive grant under CDA federal funding.

She pointed out that federal funds would pay for only the amount of the low bid on each project, but the homeowner has the option of selecting any contractor he wishes provided he pays the difference.

The job details are worked out between the homeowner and contractor, not the UR agency, but is inspected throughout by the agency.

The opening of the first two bids will take place at the Feb. 7 meeting with determination reached at that time.

**Load and dry.** Keep them in a dry, cool place, away from direct sunlight and radiator heat and water them just enough to keep the soil moist.

**Cuts also available.** If you select cut tulips, they should be hardened to make them last longer. Simply cut 1/4-inch from the stem, wash in water, and place in a vase with water.

A secretary explains: "I am worried about taking the birth control pill because my mother has had cancer. Should I take it?"

**ANSWER:** This is a matter to be carefully discussed with your physician who is familiar with your health and your family health history. In general, many doctors advise against using the birth control pill when there is a family history of breast or cervical cancer. There is no established scientific proof that the pill causes cancer, but an alternative method of birth control may be preferable in your particular case.

## PUBLIC NOTICE

MIDSTATE TELEPHONE CORPORATION FILES NEW TARIFF RATES

Permanent rates for telephone service have been filed—subject to Public Service Commission approval to be effective on or about February 1, 1978.

The filing for new rates follows a Commission order of January 12, 1978 and is designed to produce \$1.68 million in additional revenues annually.

Following are highlights of some of the proposed changes in more detail (rates quoted do not include taxes):

**Basic Monthly Service**  
 Charges for basic monthly service will increase in various amounts based on the amount of service. The exchange access charge for residence customers will increase from \$1.00 to \$1.75 per month. In general, the exchange access charge will increase 10% within the Fulton District (includes Shortville exchange) and 12% in the Jamestown District. The telephone set charge will remain at \$7.75 per month in all exchanges. The charge for the wired outlet will be \$7.75 per month in the Jamestown District and \$1.00 per month in the Fulton District.

**Telephone Listing Services**  
 The new rate for additional Telephone Listings will be \$22 per month for business customers, and \$2.10 for residence customers in all exchanges. The Te-Touch set charges will remain at \$1.50 per month in all exchanges.

**Terminal Equipment**  
 In general, monthly charges for terminal equipment will increase approximately 16.5% in the Jamestown District and 21.0% in the Fulton District. Supplemental Station Equipment includes such items as extension bells, gongs, switch keys, premium telephone charges, etc. Proposed changes in this service offerings would be as follows:

**Long Distance**  
 As directed by the Commission we would reduce rates for extra-state long distance calls by 5% effective February 1, 1978. The reduction would be offset at the same time by a \$3 million dollar increase in local exchange rates. The evening long distance period covers from 5 P.M. to 11 P.M. on weekdays and from 5 P.M. to 11 P.M. on Saturdays and Sundays. The night time period covers from 11 P.M. to 5 A.M. daily.

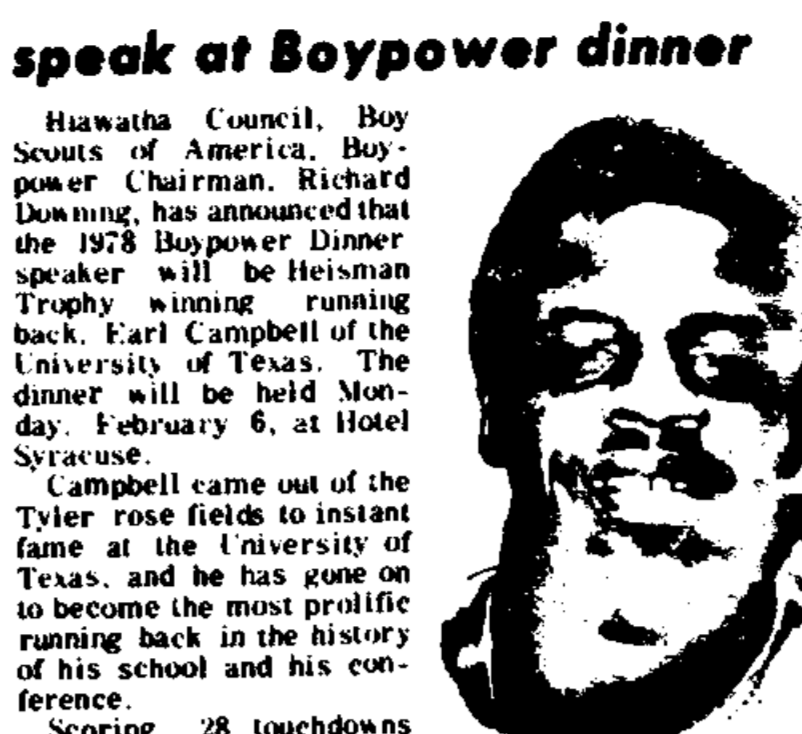

## Heisman trophy winner to speak at Boypower dinner
