Rise With Fever To Win \$25 On Debate Stage

It's not easy to speak for 20 minutes under pressure of competition with a 100-degree fever and a case of bronchitis.

But for Harold Garman, Cornell University junior from Burt, N. Y. it was worth it. He won \$25.

On a seven-hour leave from the University infirmary, Garman took second prize in the 27th annual Rise Debate Stage held in conjunction with Farm and Home Week.

First prize of \$100 went to John Kerber, a junior, from Emmetsburg, Iowa. Both Garman and Kerber took the negative side of the debate topic: "Resolved: that the consolidation of family-sized farms into large scale units is detrimental to the general welfare of the nation."

Two other contestants arguing the positive side were Elizabeth Myers of Cato and Edwin L. Boardman of Bernardsville, N. J.

Garman, son of Cameron Garman, Western New York Iron grower, maintained that large scale farm units are "highly beneficial and desirable." He contended that with more "expansion" on farms there is less need for government support. Then the government could cut taxes and afford consumers a higher standard of living, he noted.
