## Senator Keating Writes Patriot: Report From Washington

Can you imagine having to debate for more than a week on a proposal to require mem-

bers of Congress to stick to the point in their speeches on pending business? Well, that is a specific example of what has been happening in Washington, D.C. since the President's State of the Union Message on Jan. 6, 1964.

In my opinion, the American people are getting sick and tired of this kind of tom foolery from their elected representatives. So much so, in fact, that "Good Government" may well become the "sleeper" issue in the 1964 elections. When all the campaign oratory is said and done, the voters are likely to ask, "What has this candidate done to clean out the cob webs that have been strangling our Federal Government?"

The good government issue is really whether we are willing to take the steps necessary to enable our representative institutions to deal efficiently and creatively with the problems of America—today and in the future. Reports reaching me in Washington indicate the overwhelming majority of the electorate are convinced that Congress is incompetent for this vitally necessary job.

If these impressions are correct, if Congress either can't or won't set up a system of procedures that permit them to take action on the pressing problems of our time, then we all may be in real trouble. For example, by the year 2000, the population of the United States will be close to 333 million people. If you find your highways crowded now, if your kids are having trouble getting into a
