**Hemings retires at Midstate after 41 years**

Alfred N. Hemings, construction coordinator at Midstate Telephone Co., has retired after 41 years of service with the company -- a record that spans much of the history of telephony in Oswego County -- according to Midstate president Andre C. Belair.

Mr. Hemings was employed January 1, 1931 by the old Central Square Telephone Company as a combination installer, lineman and construction worker. At that time, placing a local telephone call involved picking up the receiver, making sure there were no other people on the line,

and then ringing "Central" for assistance. The operator would then connect the call manually. Automatic dial service was a postwar innovation.

In 1947, the year Central Square Telephone merged with Midstate, Mr. Hemings was promoted to construction foreman, outside plant. He advanced through the ranks becoming plant supervisor in 1956, outside plant construction superintendent for Zone II in 1968, and construction coordinator in November, 1970.

Presently he lives with his wife, Blanche, on Doris Park Road in Constantia. They have four children, Fay, Alfred, Midge and Russell, and several grandchildren.

"Forty-one years is a lot to be thankful for," commented Mr. Belair, "and we're certainly grateful to Mr. Hemings for his record of dedication and hard work. "During his career, he participated in the witnessed first-hand the revolutionary changes taking place in the industry. Because of him -- and other men and women like him, we've been able to maintain a rapid technological advance over the years. Oswego County's first total - electronic exchange, now being installed in Central Square, will inaugurate a new era of communications convenience for thousands of Midstate customers."
