Fulton's summer activities listed

The City of Fulton is fortunate to have many and varied activities for the summer months sponsored by several organizations. The following is a summary of programs for people in and around the Fulton area.

KIWANIS BASEBALL

The Fulton Kiwanis Club sponsors a Summer Baseball Program for boys ages 9 through 17. At this time there are 38 teams in 5 divisions, plus two traveling teams. This means about 40 games are played at the Kibhaven Field each week. One director and 3 instructors supervise the program and special clinics on rules, pitching, batting, catching, hitting, etc. are run at specific times during the summer months. Mr. Murrett DeLorme is Director of the program.

4-H CLUB ACTION

The local 4-H Club is continually operating and initiating excellent activities. The Rent-A-Kid Program is doing very well for youths 16 and over. If you are interested call and put in an application. On July 14th and 15th this program will offer a paint school to help give painting experience to youth in the Rent-A-Kid Program.

The "Happening" for children in the 8 - 12 age group will take place at Pathfinder Courts and Volney Elementary School from July 24th-28th and Guyer Park and VanBuren Park from July 31st to August 4th. 4-H also sponsors camps throughout the summer months. TEEN CENTER

The Teen Center for boys and girls ages 13 through 19 will be open Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Sunday evenings from 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. (11:00 p.m. on Fridays) throughout the summer. Starting July 5th a mini-craft program from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. will take place. Horse back riding, dances and other special programs will also take place throughout the summer months. July 28th, 29th, and 30th, the Center will sponsor a canoe trip to upper Saranac. All people intending to make the trip must take a training program. The next Teen Center dance will be on July 12th. Any questions on the Teen Center program can be answered by Mr. Tony Panbianco, Director of the Teen Center.

ADULT SOFTBALL

The Fulton Softball Association continues to provide excellent facilities, competition and program for men ages 16 and up. Over 600 men participate in softball on 38 different teams. These people play 5 to 6 days per week and several special tournaments throughout the summer, make for much enjoyment for spectators as well as the players themselves.

FULTON CONSOLIDATED SCHOOLS

This summer will find the G. Ray Bodley Gymnasium open from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday evenings. The Fairgrieve Gymnasium will be open on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Boys and girls ages 10-14 should come from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. and ages 14-19 from 8:00 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Weight training, gymnastics, basketball, wrestling, table tennis, track & field are only some of the activities to be offered.

The Fulton schools, under Mr. Donald Kunzweiler and Angelo Godici, will send approximately 225 youths to Camp Susie from 1 to 2 weeks throughout the summer.

Remedial summer school programs plus typing and driver education will be offered to the secondary school students in the Fulton School District.

YMCA

The YMCA runs a Day Camp each summer for boys and girls. This program begins July 10th and persons may attend for a minimal fee. If more information is needed call 2-2672.

SWIM PROGRAM

The Recreation swim program in the City's three swim areas (West Side pool at Recreation Park, East Side Pool (At Rowlee's Beach) and Stevenson Beach (on Lake Neahshawang) has a staff of 20 people. A waterfront Director (who holds lifeguard, teaching and handicap teaching qualifications), 11 instructors (lifeguards who also have teaching certificates), 3 lifeguards (holding senior lifesaving certificates), 3 bath house attendants, 2 ticket sellers, 4 basket checkers, and 5 water safety aids (these are teacher aids, 14 years of age and over that in addition to junior lifesaving as passed the new teacher's aid course).

Our lessons programs is in strict accordance with the Red Cross is broken up into two four week sessions which we have to limit to 500 each session to teach properly. Classes offered are beginners through Senior Lifesaving. Lessons are taught at the two pools each

morning Monday through Friday between 10 and 12. There is no open swimming just lessons at the pools in the morning. The beach is open for open swimming continually from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. and the pools re-open for open swimming from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. and 6 - 8 p.m. Each area has a head guard who is under the Waterfront Director who is under the Superintendent. All instructions are free of charge. At the East Side Pool between 12 noon and 1 p.m. handicap children and adults are taught by our two certified handicap instructors (the East Side pool has passed the State requirements for the teaching of the handicapped).

PARK PROGRAM

The 11 City parks have a registration of over 1,000 children this past year. Each park has a director, who is responsible to the coordinator who is responsible to the Superintendent and the coordinator directs all park programs. The weekly themes of the parks are originated in the main office before the park program begins. Meetings are held each Monday by the directors and the coordinator and the weekly themes planned. There is an Arts and Crafts Director that goes from area to area each day to instruct arts and crafts. An important part of the parks program is the annual musical and play production which is under the Music and Drama instructor. To end the park program a field day is held at Recreation Park and each Park participates in a varied number of activities and events and the area with the most points wins a large trophy which they display the following year. Prizes are given and free lunch is served to all the children plus free swimming. Parks in Fulton are:

Patrick, VanBuren, Oswego Falls, Lincoln, Recreation, Hullett, Rowlee, Guyer, East Side, Foster and Lanigan.

Tennis instruction at the G. Ray Bodley High School under Mr. Jim Devitt is also planned for the summer months.

Oswego County land search and rescue team to meet Monday

The Oswego County Pioneer Land Search and Rescue Team will consider very important matters during the next scheduled meeting, Monday, July 17 according to executive coordinator Robert Bartholomew. Bartholomew today announced the importance of all members attending. The meeting will be held at 7:20 p.m. in Civil Defense Rooms of the County Branch Office Building located opposite Mimi's on Route 57 north in Fulton.

Items listed on the agenda include the briefing in the August field exercise which Bartholomew stated promises to be the most challenging to date. The Oswego County team will join forces with the Rome Reconnaissance Association, the New York State Police the New York State Environmental Conservation Department rescue team, and the Adirondack Mountain Club, Onondaga Chapter Inc. for a simulated search and rescue operation at a site in upstate New York. Members will be hearing a report and mapping plans for this event at Monday's con-fab.

Plans for the September exercise will also be outlined according to Bartholomew.

The team, which will celebrate its first birthday later this month, will be hearing the report of the nominating committee for officers and other elective posts at the meeting. Chairman of the nominating committee is Norman Hayden, review officer. Nominations will be

heard from the floor at the time of Hayden's report and election of officers etc. for the ensuing year will take place at the August session. A revised Code of Ethics for the team will be aired, in other important business the executive coordinator pointed out, in again stressing the urgency of all members being present for this meeting July 17. Persons, 18 years of age and older, interested in learning more about the team or becoming members are invited to attend the meeting.

NOTICE OF HEARING LOCAL LAW 1, 1972

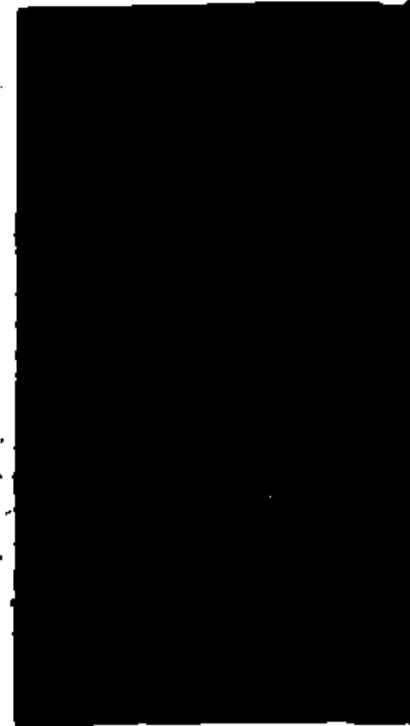

This Local Law provides for a new term for the Assessor, the establishment of the Board of Assessment Review and removal of titles no longer applicable to the Municipal Government.

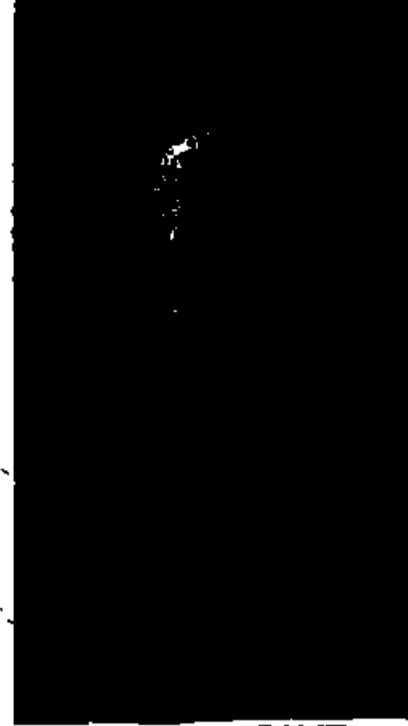

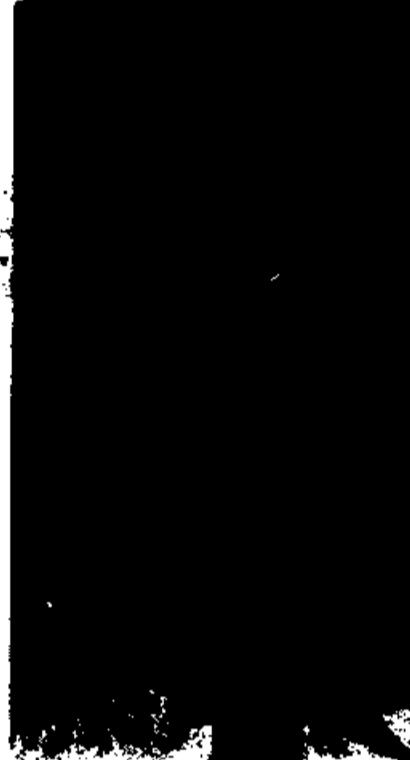

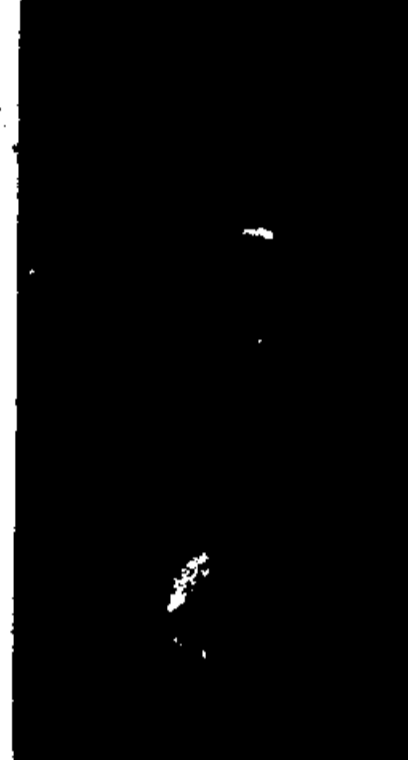
