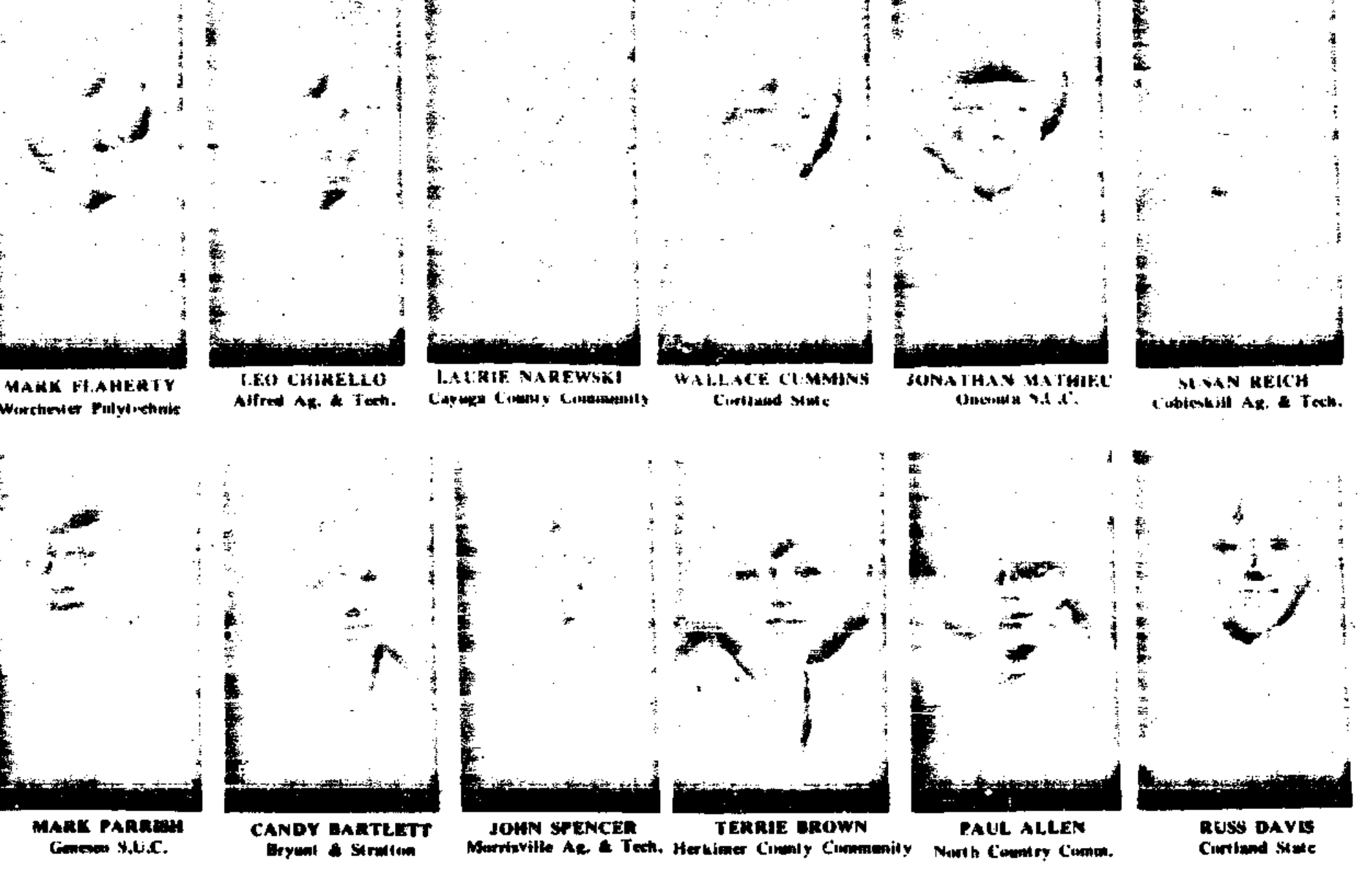

Keyboard jazz topic of SUNY Oswego workshop

Keyboard jazz improvisation, a workshop for teachers and high school students wishing to begin or further their improvisational skills, will be held at the SUNY Oswego campus June 27 through July 1. The team of Jerry Estine and Anthony Crain will be offering an intensive workshop devoted to the development of jazz piano skills. Morning and afternoon sessions will include the study and application of basic and advanced techniques of keyboard jazz improvisation. Sessions will include demonstrations by the Estine/Crain team, which has performed at numerous jazz festivals at the SUNY Oswego campus since 1976. They perform the great popular song literature of the 1930's through the 1970's, giving the literature their own unique arrangements and styling. Workshop participants will reside in double occupancy rooms on the campus and will be served meals in the Hewitt Union, adjacent to their summer dorms. Fee for the workshop is \$115, including room and board. 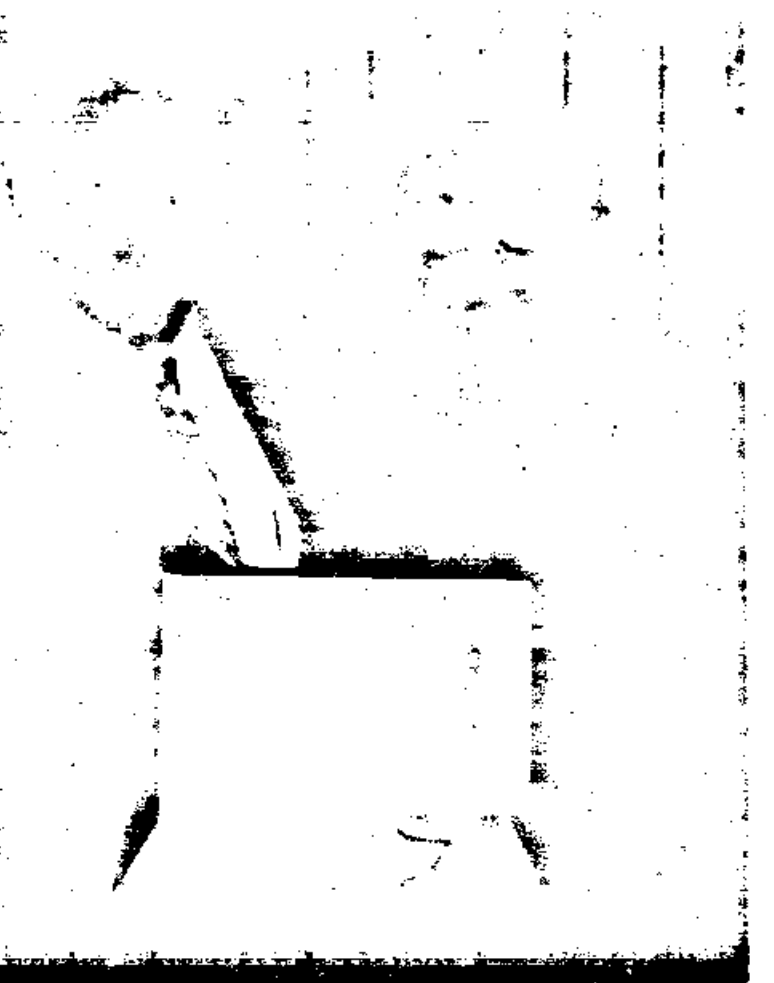

Oswego Rotary to sponsor road run, roller-ski rally

On Saturday, July 10, the Oswego Rotary Club will sponsor a road run and roller-ski rally for area runners and roller skiers. The races will begin at Lee Hall Gymnasium on the State University campus at Oswego. The first event, at 9:30 a.m., will be the 10 kilometer road run. The roller-ski rally will be sponsored by the U.S. Ski Association, in which cross-country skiers from throughout the northeastern United States will be sharpening their skills in preparation for winter meets and Olympic time trials. Road running will begin at 10 a.m., with a one-mile fun run. At the completion of the one-mile, runners from throughout Oswego and New York will compete on 5 and 10 kilometer courses laid out along some Lake Ontario and on Oswego campus. Foster care program: Frustration, aggravation, laughing, crying... but most of all, rewarding

The Foster Care Program, which is run through the Oswego County Department of Social Services, is much more than the average citizen thinks. David became foster parent of one foster mother, "frustration and aggravation, crying and laughing." But most of all, it's rewarding. Foster parents are given by the foster parents to the children in their care. But usually, the foster parent is not just an effort on their part but is rewarded when they succeed in helping a child. It is not only the juvenile delinquents, as it is usually thought of when one thinks of "foster care" but it is any number of average children and young people who need help outside the traditional family structure. Many reasons for which children are recommended for foster care are of various kinds: mental retardation, emotional problems, or both. As a result of a family situation, beyond the control of the child, in many cases, the "victims" of the situation are the children, and the best help available is provided through foster care. One young person who needed foster care has returned the favor of receiving love and support at a crucial time. Mrs. Fry will get up at 5:30 or 6:00 a.m. to get two of her children off to the special programs at school. But according to Mrs. Fry, "Foster parenting is like eating candy, once you start you can't stop." The Department of Social Services Foster Parenting Program provides for training of persons interested in becoming foster parents. The goal of this program is to provide foster parents with an understanding of what it is all about, and give them an idea of what will be required of them. This training also helps foster parents to develop coping skills and build a support network among themselves. A foster parent's group encourages the parents to call on one another for support and help during difficult situations. The success of foster care is to provide the support and guidance necessary to allow the children to return to their natural families.
