C. W. A. IS TO TAKE CENSUS OF BUSINESS

Rev. Carl M. Worden, chairman of the local CWA, has announced that on request of the Department of Commerce at Washington, the local organization will co-operate in taking a census of business within the next two weeks.

Mr. Worden stated that Lester Ford, George Washburn and Robert Boland had been appointed to take charge of the work. They will call on manufacturing and business places in search of information for the department.

These men will be concerned with financial operations and the number of employees engaged. The census will be for the year 1933. Mr. Worden pointed out that although officials of the plants and business were not compelled to give the information sought, their co-operation was requested in the work.

Employees of the CWA who operate trucks have been placed on a new wage schedule Mr. Worden said Saturday. The new rates will be effective this week. The proposed new schedule is as follows: 150 an hour. Under the new schedule the drivers received 80 cents an hour. The city formerly furnished gas and oil. Under the new schedule, drivers will supply their own gas and oil.

Debate on Fulton proposed airport project involving an expenditure of \$40,000, is expected within a week, CWA officials announced last week, following a conference.

It was learned that Red Creek is making a determined bid to obtain the airport project for that place. Dwight Murphy, executive director of the local unit, Rev. Carl M. Worden and Charles Smith, aeronautical inspector, conferred the past week. Mr. Murphy recently returned from New York city, where he conferred with state officials concerning the project. Administration officials expect that about \$25,000 will be expended for labor and \$15,000 for equipment.

The common council, several days ago, empowered Mayor William Smith to enter into an agreement for the lease of the field, which is now operated by the Kelly brothers. The owners have been signed and are in the hands of state CWA officials.

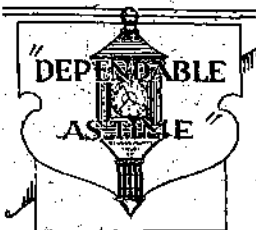

VISCOME GETS FIVE YEARS.

A sentence of five years in state prison was passed on Joseph Viscome of Fulton, on his plea of guilty to second degree grand larceny before County Judge Don A. Colony at the February term of county court Tuesday. He was charged with the theft of an automobile at Fulton on Dec. 10, 1933, owned by Kaion Dorosar.

Viscome, and a companion, Walter Kywiski, are charged with having stolen a car, driven it across country to Mesa, Arizona, where they sold it to a second-hand dealer for \$50, and a Ford car, and then went to Los Angeles, where they were arrested and brought back here for trial.

Viscome was a second indictment against Viscome for grand larceny, also for the theft of a car, and it was disclosed that he had previous convictions to make him a third offender. Conviction of first degree grand larceny would have resulted in a much longer sentence than that meted out.

Viscome admitted having spent a year and a day in a federal penitentiary on McNeill's Island, Portland, Oregon, on a sentence of a similar offense, claimed to have been committed on the Pacific coast.

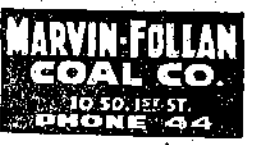

SANATORIUM REPORT.

The report of activities at the Oswego county sanatorium at Orwell shows the following:

Patients in sanatorium on Dec. 31, 1933; admitted during January, 8; discharged, 6; patients in sanatorium on Jan. 31, 1934; male patients, 68; female patients, 44; total treated during January, 107; total days treatment, 3,107; average treated per day, 100; total days pay patients, 723; total days free patients, 2,384; superintendents visits, 27; visits by Dr. Hollis in absence of superintendent, 13; laboratory examinations, 148; for outside physicians, 70; X-ray examinations, 50. Cash received during the month, \$148; vouchers for physically handicapped children, \$523.

The report of Lucy J. Vincent, county visiting nurse, shows 8 towns and music parties visited, during which she called on 107 patients. This, with various other visits made, brought the total to 168.

The school report shows 23 pupils enrolled with a percentage of attendance of 95.
