Since poultry grain mixtures now contain little or no yellow corn which is the only grain source of vitamin A, poultry flocks should be allowed to eat only as much grain as mash, for mash will have to supply the vitamin A.

Payments by the government to help offset increased dairy production costs in New York State will be 40 cents a hundredweight on fluid milk and 5 cents a pound on butterfat in butter and cream, based on farm records of sales since October 1, 1943.

Farmers can now buy from their dealer two milk cans in any three-month period without any need to get a purchase permit from the county rationing committee. They need only certify to the dealer that they are farmers and use the cans in dairy production.

Milk, eggs, meat, fruits, vegetables, and fuelwood can be had from the farm, or, in part, from the grounds
