REORGANIZATION OF MERCHANTS' C. OF C. DIVISION

A representative group of Fulton retail merchants met Tuesday evening at the Chamber of Commerce with officers of the Chamber and a committee from the Manufacturers' division. The purpose of the meeting was to plan a stronger merchants group patterned after the manufacturers' division and to promote a stronger affiliation with the Chamber of Commerce.

After an informal discussion, Murray Wilson, chairman of the merchants' association, appointed a committee composed of James Shepard, chairman, Melvin Freeman, Joseph Cuffari, Lynn Gilven, Seymour Prowda, Al Federick and Richard Gardner to arrange a plan of organization and to list civic projects which could be better served through such an organization. This plan is to be submitted at a dinner meeting of all merchants at the Chamber of Commerce on Monday, Feb. 10th. Mr. Shepard plans to get this committee together again this week to start work on the arrangements.

The Manufacturers' division was represented at the Tuesday night meeting by John Haskell, chairman, Culver Luesier, Paul Cooper and William Madgely, along with Richard Ely, vice-president, and Wesley Gatman, executive secretary of the Chamber of Commerce. This same group was invited, and plans to attend, the dinner meeting to help with the reorganization plans.

CHOCOLATE CO. PORTAL CASE IS STILL ON

The report out of Utica the first of the week that the portal-to-portal case against the Peter Caillier Kohler Swiss Chocolates had been discontinued was erroneous.

What actually took place in federal court was a motion to dismiss made by John E. Lynch of Hancock, Dorr Ryan & Shove, attorneys for the company. Lynch argued the interrogatories, which would determine the amount of back pay each employee could claim, were prematurely filed; and Sidney Greenberg, attorney for the unions, agreeing, Judge Brennan dismissed the interrogatories and granted a 90-day extension in which complaints may be answered.

Courts, in other cases brought in U. S. court for portal-to-portal pay, have ruled defendants are not required to answer questions before service of answers, for which a 20-day period is allowed.

The interrogatories ask that companies give occupations and job classifications of employees before Oct. 24, 1938, the date of the complaints, as well as total hours spent on the premises, starting time, lunch and quitting time; hours paid for at regular and overtime wages; dates employees were on military leave and copies of all notices concerning hours of work.

The Peter Caillier Kohler Co. contended that it would take available personnel about two years to complete the information required, working on an overtime basis. It was estimated that 13,500 man hours would be required by skilled payroll personnel to go through 1,155,000 time cards. It also was claimed that under existing regulations, any of all of 6,000 past or future employees might intervene and the process would have to be repeated.

Lynch said the 90-day extension was sought on the basis of a possibility that federal legislation might be enacted to relieve corporations of the necessity of answering such questions; and pending a decision on a case involving the Mt. Clemens Pottery Works, original defendants in the first portal pay case.

Cooking Game

As wild meat is naturally drier and tougher than domestic meat, the general rule is to cook game for a longer time at a lower temperature than other meats. A furnace is used with a warm air heating system. A boiler is used only with hot water and steam heating systems.

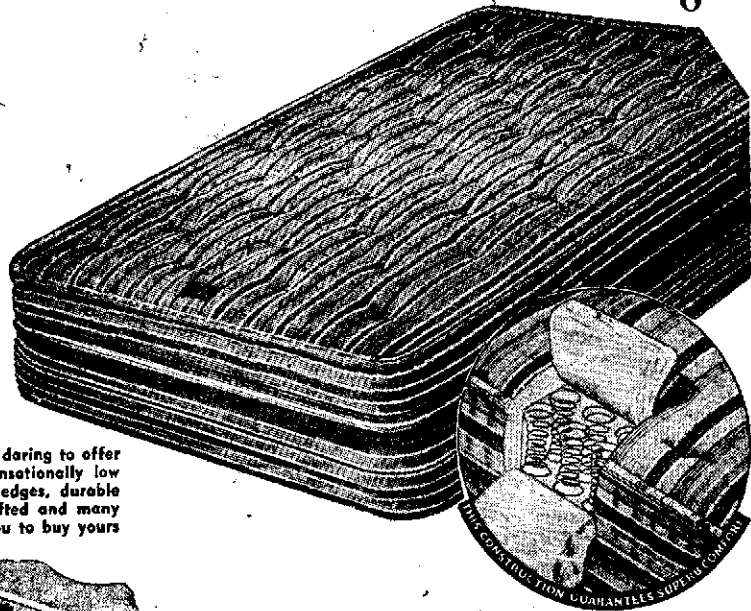
