ENJOY HOMEMADE PRETZELS

This winter, enjoy hot pretzels at home as well as from the carts of side-walk vendors.

Homemade pretzel rods can be made with less salt than you would get in commercial pretzels.

They are a welcome addition to any party to be enjoyed along with a mug of piping hot chocolate.

HOMEMADE PRETZEL RODS

Bread dough enough for one loaf
One egg
Salt

Cut the dough into 1/4-pound chunks after kneading.

Roll out each chunk of dough with a rolling pin until it is 1/4" thick.

Slice the rolled dough into 1/2" by 8" strips using a pizza cutter or razor-sharp knife.

Place these strips on oiled cookie sheets, not touching.

Brush lightly with beaten egg. Dust with salt to taste.

Allow to rise in a warm place until they are about 1/4" high. Bake in a preheated 350° oven for about 15 minutes.

Reduce heat to 200° and continue to bake for another 15 minutes, or until the pretzels are an even medium brown.

If still slightly soft inside, reduce the heat to the lowest possible setting and allow them to dry out completely.

The equivalent of one loaf of bread dough yields about three dozen pretzel rods.
