

1st EXHIBITION AT TYLER ART GALLERY

"Selections from the State University College at Oswego Permanent Collection of Art" will be the first exhibition of the fall season at the Tyler Art Gallery on the Oswego campus. Featuring works by distinguished artists of three centuries, the exhibition will open on Thursday, Aug. 29, and will continue thru Sept. 22.

Among those whose work will be presented are Alex Katz, Max Pechstein, Reginald Marsh, Lucien Pissarro, Jean Baptiste Greuze, George Luks, Alexander Calder and Sir Joshua Reynolds.

One of the earlier acquisitions for the college's permanent collection was Amelia Watson's "She Questions," a portrait of Mary V. Lee painted in 1885. Subsequently nearly 200 original works of art have been acquired through the generosity of alumni and friends or through Faculty-Student Association purchases. In addition to its use for study purpose, the collection, which is normally displayed in public areas and offices, aids in creating a visually stimulating, attractive and educational campus environment.

"Selections from the State University College at Oswego Permanent Collection of Art" may be seen at the Tyler Art Gallery during regular visiting hours, Monday through Friday, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Saturday and Sunday, 12:30 p.m. - 4:30 p.m. The gallery is closed on holidays. D-O-T- TO RECEIVE BIDS

Descriptions of highway bridge and canal projects for which the State Department of Transportation will open bids on September 5 were given today by Transportation Commissioner Raymond T. Schuler.

"Funds for these proposed contracts," Commissioner Schuler said, "have been made available through budget recommendations of Governor Wilson and approval by the Legislature. State funds, moreover have been supplemented wherever possible by Federal aid."

The Commissioner said the projects are almost entirely devoted to improvement of existing travel facilities. "Real economies are achieved when we halt costly deterioration and

avert the need for more extensive repairs later on."

The largest single group of jobs come under the DOT's program for Highway Reconditioning and Preservation (R&P). Road sections will be reconditioned in Essex, Montgomery, Onondaga, Ulster, Westchester, Nassau and Suffolk Counties.

Old bridges will be replaced in Genesee and Allegany Counties, highways reconstructed in Albany County, Erie Canal improvements made in Schoharie and Orleans Counties and a ramp built to increase safety at two merging highways on Long Island.

All bids will be opened publicly at 10:30 a.m. in the hearing room of the DOT Administration and Engineering Build-

ing at the State Office Campus Albany. Project descriptions follow:

ONONDAGA
Reconditioning Route 31 for 6.7 miles in the Towns of Lysander and Clay and Village of Baldwinsville. The improvements will be made between Routes 48 and 481. The roadway pavement, varying up to 60 feet wide, will be resurfaced with asphalt. New signals responsive to the actual flow of traffic will be installed at the Route 370-Mechanic Street corner and at Oswego Street in Baldwinsville, the roadway will be widened at the post office next to River Street, new guide railings will be installed rural areas and highway drainage will be improved.

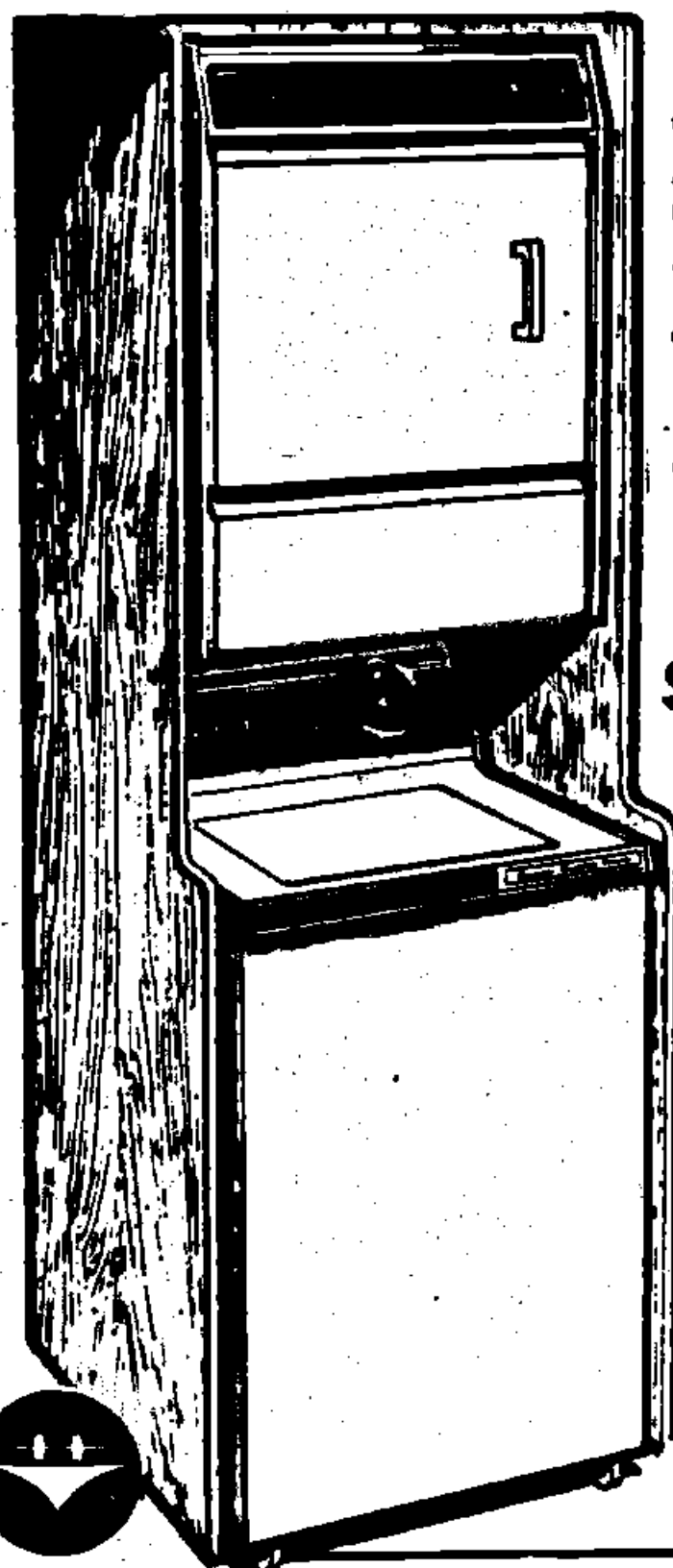

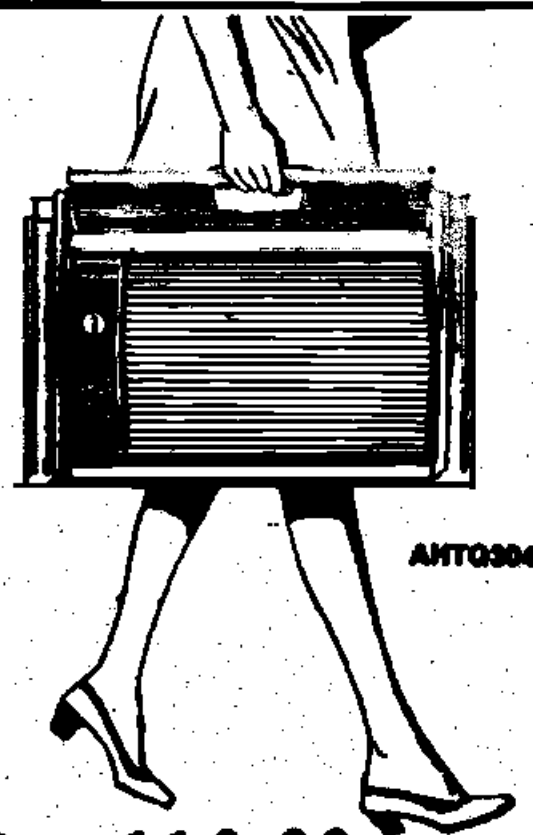

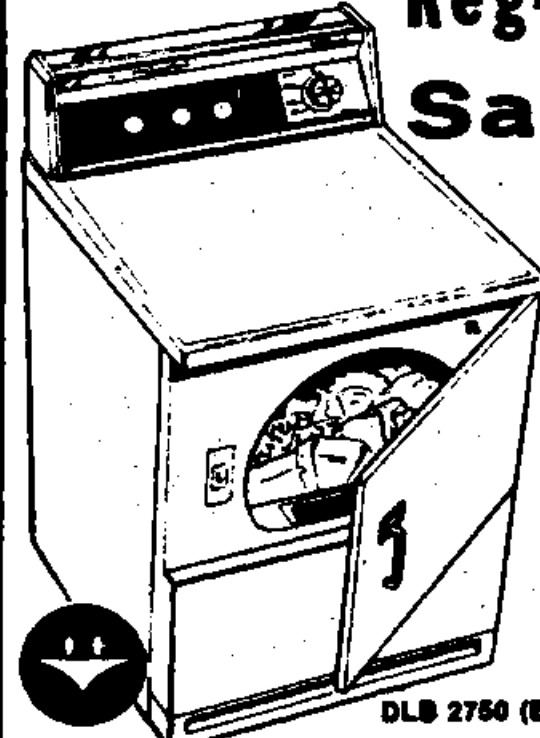
