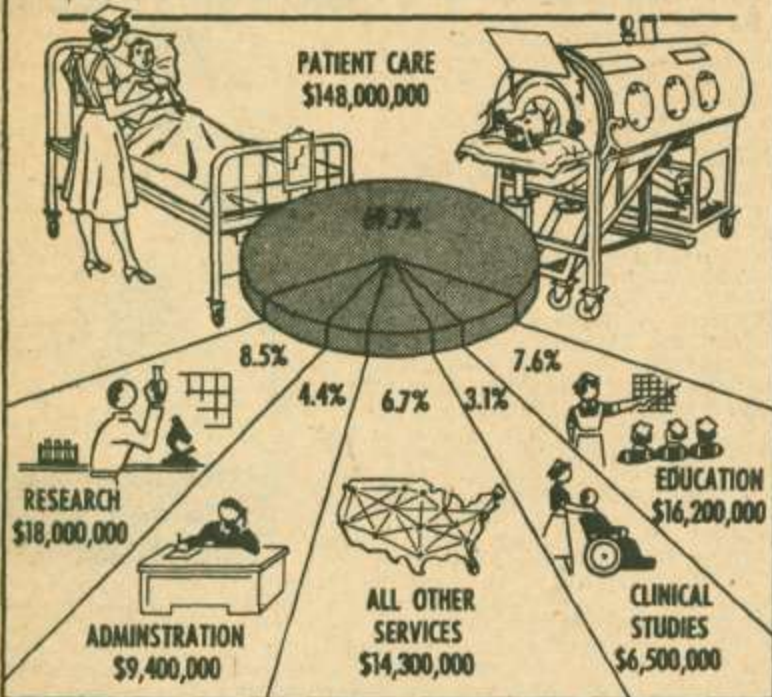


15 YEARS

Although more than two-thirds of March of Dimes funds goes for care of patients needing aid, the long-haul program of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis is the development of a polio preventive through research, professional education and clinical study. Last year it was shown that the blood fraction gamma globulin provided a degree of temporary protection against paralytic polio. However, a safe, effective polio vaccine for human beings is yet to be developed.

Final plans for the Mothers March on Polio were made at a meeting held in the City Council Chambers January 19. Joseph Pistick, General Chairman, announced at the meeting that all was in readiness and mothers both in Fulton and the outlying districts are preparing to march between 7:00 and 8:00 P.M., Wednesday evening, January 28. Mr. Pistick has requested that all homes arrange to keep their porches lighted, and also told workers that the citizens would be reminded of the oncoming drive by the tolling of church bells and factory whistles that would be blown at 7:00 P.M. the evening of the campaign.
