

Robert G. Macdonald, principal of Fulton High school for the past twenty-five years, will succeed G. Ray Bodley as superintendent of schools when Mr. Bodley retires at the end of the present school year. A graduate of Wesleyan University, Mr. Macdonald received his master's degree from Columbia University in 1922 and has since done extensive work in the field of school administration at Syracuse University. He is a member of Phi Beta Kappa. Mr. Macdonald taught in Oswego High School and was, for eight years, principal of Manlius High school before becoming principal of the local high school in 1920. In announcing the appointment, J. E. Lanigan, President of the Fulton Board of Education, said, "We feel that we have made an excellent choice for the superintendency. Mr. Macdonald is a man of proved ability in the field of school administration, thoroughly familiar with the Fulton school system and the problems that confront it, and highly acceptable to teachers, pupils and parents. He fills to a high degree the exacting specifications which the Board of Education laid down for the superintendency."
