The Fulton Industrial Expansion Committee met at City Hall Thursday evening, Jan. 12. This was the first meeting which the group has held since it was appointed by Mayor Johnson. Membership of the committee consists of George Curran, chairman; Joe Fstick, Henry Cardinali, Colson Carr, John Myers and Uly Papini, secretary. Much of the meeting was devoted to a review of the work done by the previous committee. It was felt that the survey which that group had accomplished was a very thorough job and that enough material was at hand to prepare a brochure on the City of Fulton. It was agreed that this committee will concentrate its efforts on locating prospective industries. Toward that end, long range plans were discussed for enlisting a broad base of public support. The next meeting was tentatively set for Jan. 25th, at which time the committee will meet with officials of the State Dept. of Commerce.
