

Dry intaglio printing is a process of printing directly from an engraved plate. The ink laid upon the surface, rather than being crushed into the paper fiber as in ordinary printing.

The printing on a fine personal calling card feels raised because such "engraved" cards are products of dry intaglio printing.

The new printing method makes possible the use of multicolors to depict memorable events and figures in our history. The Statue of Liberty stamp is the forerunner of a proposed new series of regular stamps to replace the 32 denominations of the 1938 series featuring the pictures of 32 deceased Presidents.
