## Maternal Education Classes Start Tonight

The Maternal Education Association, sponsored by the Adult Division of the Fulton Board of Education is opening the 12th series of Mother's Classes on Thursday, January 15 at 7:30 P.M. They will be held in the Lee Memorial Hospital Auxiliary room.

These lectures and film showings are open to prospective and young parents and are free of charge. A special session is devoted to fathers.

Relaxation classes, another part of the same course, are a series of 4 classes designed to teach expectant mothers passive exercises to help them during labor. Learning proper usage of their muscles allows them to perform regular household duties in such a way as to prevent fatigue.

Mothers' and fathers' classes give prospective parents information about pregnancy and care of the newborn baby. Lectures by local doctors and nurses are co-ordinated with a film and a question and answer period at each session.

Certificates will be awarded to mothers attending at least 5 of the 6 classes which make up the series. Anyone missing more than one session must make it up at a future series before she can receive her certificate.
