Weights, Measures Report for 1959 Made by Bassett

This annual report from the department of weights and measures has been sent the New York State Department of Weights and Measures from the City of Fulton. The law requires that it be submitted before Dec. 1st.

The local sealer of weights and measures, Wade Bassett made the following report of tests made and results made within the last year.

All types of scales tested, total 478; 454 found correct and 25 found incorrect.

Weights tested, 721; 719 found correct and 2 incorrect.

Gas Pumps tested 198; 189 correct and 9 incorrect.

Liquid Measures tested, 132; 130 correct and 2 incorrect.

Tank Truck Meters tested, 20; 19 correct and 1 incorrect.

Yard Measures tested, 52; 52 correct.

Checkweighed 8,091 prepackaged merchandise, 7,427 correct, 220 overweight and 444 underweight.

Twelve warnings issued and no complaints.

The National Bureau of Weights and Measures is promoting each year, "The National Weights and Measures Week," which has been set for March 1 thru March 7th. Considerable publicity will be spent on it throughout the nation so as to acquaint the consumer more about weights and measures, and how it can affect their pocket-books.

Veterans Pensioners Must File Annual Income Report

Veterans and widows of veterans receiving non-service connected pension payments must make their annual income report by the end of January 1960, according to Joseph Beale, Director Oswego County Veterans Service Agency.

More than 12,000 recipients of non-service connected pensions in the 18-county area of Central New York State served by this VA Office will receive a special income questionnaire card for making their report with their regular checks early in January. By reporting promptly, they will avoid risk of having payments stopped, Beale added. Regulations require that payments must be discontinued if the income report is not received within 30 days. Pension payments cease if the income of a single individual exceeds \$1400 or \$2700 for beneficiaries with dependents. This income limitation will continue to apply through June 1960, and changes in the pension law do not become effective until July 1 of next year Beale pointed out.

Shortly after March 1, pensioners now on the rolls will receive a special form from the VA. This will explain how to apply for payments at revised rates authorized under the new pension law. Until then, those currently receiving payments are urged not to write to the Va regarding possible entitlement as such inquiries would serve no purpose.

No income questionnaires are sent to veterans or dependents who are receiving service connected compensation, Beale said.
