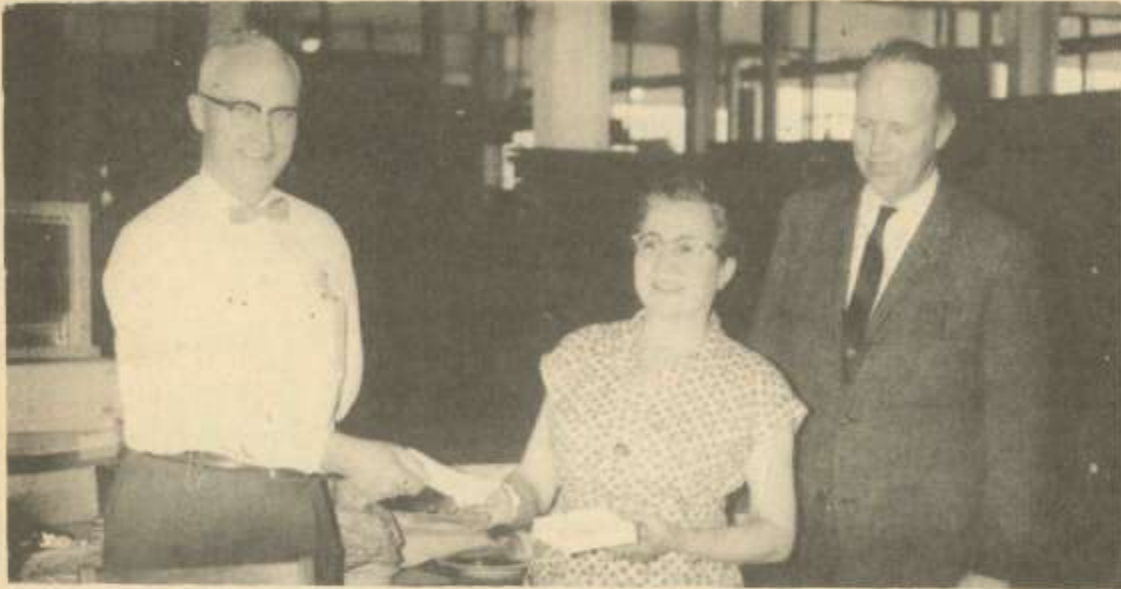


TERMINATES 30 YEARS AT COLUMBIA
