The Board of Directors of the Finger Lakes Sugar Beet Growers Association adopted unanimously a resolution to accept the sugar beet contract for 1965 with Empire State Sugar Company, Inc.

Frank Turek, President of the growers association, notified General Manager Charles C. Miller of Empire State Sugar of the action taken by the board.

A series of meetings to explain the contract with potential growers in each of the eight counties designated in the sugar beet allotment started January 18. Growers will be offered an opportunity to sign contracts at the meetings which will be under the supervision of Mark R. Berrett, Director of Agriculture of Empire State Sugar.

The counties involved in the acreage allotment are Cayuga, Seneca, Wayne, Ontario, Yates, Tompkins, Onondaga and Oswego and counties adjoining thereto.
