### Nine Mile 2 Decision Put Off

It may be months before the Niagara Mohawk Power Corp. decides the future of the Nine Mile Unit 2 nuclear plant, a spokesman said last week.

The Niagara Mohawk official, Maceon Felton, said the utility will wait until the Nuclear Regulatory Commission makes a "final decision" on changes stemming from the accident at Three Mile Island.

When the utility first announced that it was laying off most of the construction work force at the plant, officials said they expected to announce their plans around the first of this year. At that time, they said the layoffs were caused by "regulatory uncertainty" in the wake of Three Mile Island.

The plant is now about one-third complete, Felton said.

Meanwhile, a letter that arrived in the NRC public document room in Oswego last

week indicated that the utility had not changed its plans on the startup of operation for Nine Mile Unit 2 as of Dec. 17, less than a week before the layoffs were announced.

The letter to the NRC said NiMo plans to load uranium fuel into the plant in March, 1984, and start commercial operation in October, 1984. "If there are any changes in our plans, we will notify you promptly," it said.

Felton said the plans haven't changed despite the layoff. Asked how the schedule could be accomplished with the slowdown in construction, he said: "Construction is still going on."

If the layoffs had not been ordered, Felton said, Niagara Mohawk would have completed the plant sooner, but still would have waited until 1984 before loading fuel, he said.
