NYS Young Boaters' Safety Course Slated

Young boaters between the ages of 10 and 16 years must have a New York State Safety Certificate in order to operate a motorboat on New York State waters without an adult aboard.

Young people interested in obtaining the certificate may

enroll in the four-session course commencing Saturday, May 9 at the Naval Militia Building, Lake Street, Oswego. The classes, sponsored by the New York State Parks and Recreation's Bureau of Marine and Recreation Vehicles, will be taught

by qualified New York State instructors from the United States Coast Guard Auxiliary, Flotilla 2-7, Oswego.

The course will consist of four, two-hour sessions on consecutive Saturdays starting at 9:30 a.m. May 9. Enrollment will be at the first

session.

Course materials will be furnished free of charge, but students should come with pencil and paper.

Tennis Clinics Slated

A tennis clinic with video tape analysis for beginners, advanced beginners, and intermediate players will be offered Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays starting May 25 at SUNY Oswego by the Continuing Education Office.

Both morning and evening classes will be offered. Each class will be limited to 12 players of similar skill levels.

Dr. Walter J. Nitardy of the men's physical education faculty, a veteran tennis teacher, who has successfully introduced the game to many beginners and refined skills of others, will instruct. Players may enroll for 5, 8, or 13 lessons at the Continuing Education Office at 611 Culklin Hall on the Oswego campus.

Class times for beginners

are scheduled at 10 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.; and at 11 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. for advanced beginners and intermediates.

Sessions will be held at the courts adjacent to Romney Fieldhouse, or in the event of rain, in Laker Hall.

Clinics for beginners will introduce fundamentals of ground strokes and serving. Advanced beginners will refine ground strokes, partic-

ularly backhand and serving skills, and will be introduced to net play.

Clinics for intermediate players will concentrate on control and strategic use of ground strokes and serve, along with refinement of net play.

Courses are also being offered in golf in June for beginners and high handicap players.
