undecided as of yet, must have 40 people.

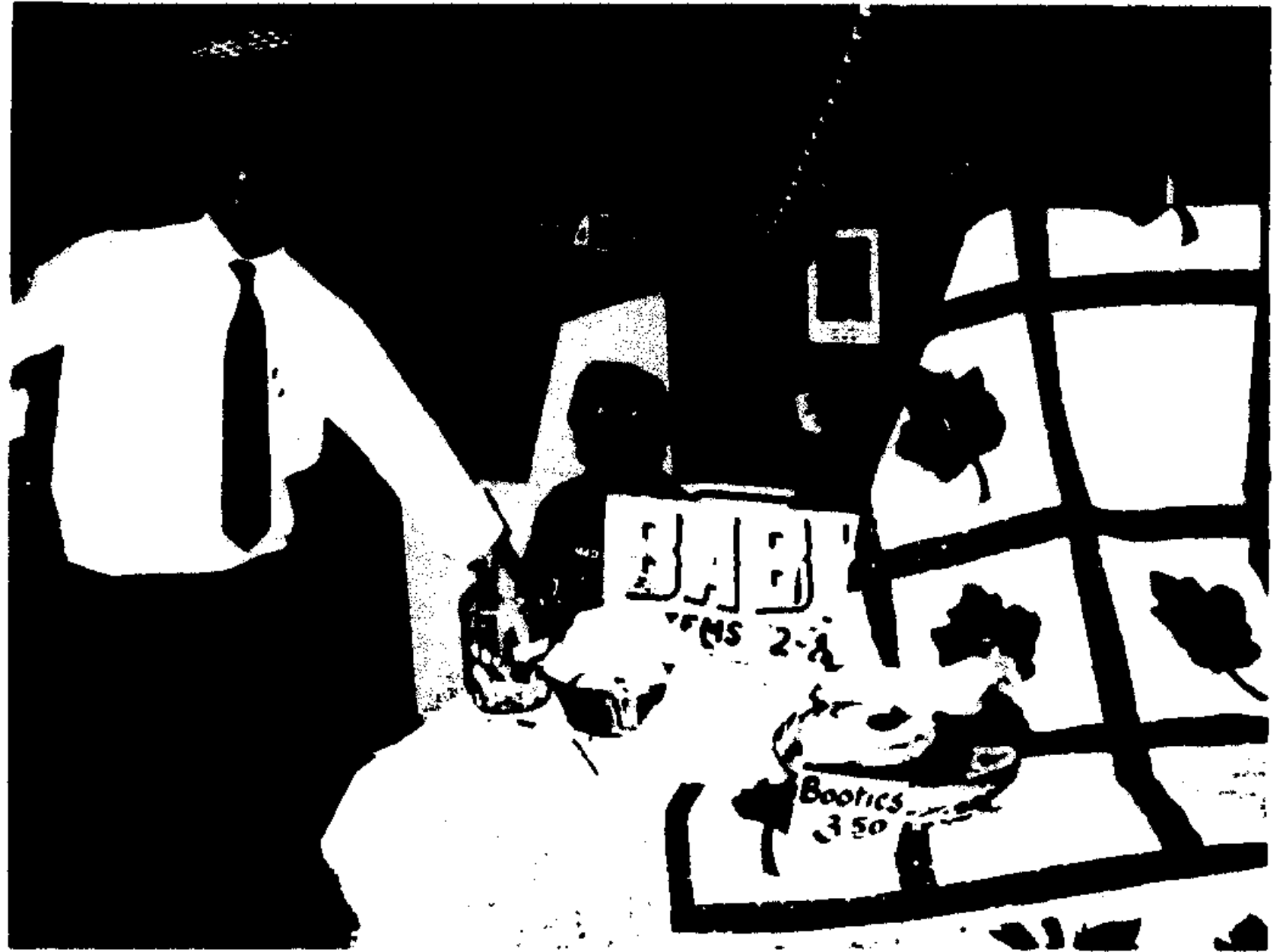
Otto Pfahl is doing well from his hand operation, but still in the cast.
